14		fixed part of the structure, or to the construction,

This exemption 2 shall not apply in any case where a building permit is 3 required regardless of the aggregate contract price, 4 nor where the undertaking is only a part of a larger 5 or major project or operation, whether undertaken by 6 the same or a different contractor or in which a 7 division of the project or operation is made in 8 contracts of amounts of not more than \$1,000 for the 9 purpose of evading this chapter or otherwise; 10 (5)A registered architect or professional engineer acting 11 solely in the person's professional capacity; 12 (6)Any person who engages in the activities regulated in 13 this chapter as an employee with wages as the person's 14 sole compensation; 15 (7)Owner-builders exempted under section 444-2.5; 16 Any joint venture if all members thereof hold licenses (8) 17 issued under this chapter; 18 Any project or operation where it is determined by the (9) 19 board that less than ten persons are gualified to 20 perform the work in question and that the work does 21 not pose a potential danger to public health, safety, 22 and welfare; or
