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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and		
3	to read as follows:		
4	"PART . SINGLE-USE CHECKOUT BAG FEE		
5	§342H-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the		
6	context otherwise requires:		
7	"Business" means any commercial enterprise or		
8	establishment, including sole proprietorships, joint ventures,		
9	partnerships, and corporations, or any other legally cognizable		
10	entity, and includes all employees of the business or any		
11	independent contractors associated with the business.		
12	"Reusable bag" means a bag with handles that is		
13	specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse and		
14	is:		
15	(1) Made of cloth or other machine washable fabric; or		
16	(2) Made of other durable material suitable for re-use,		
17	including plastic that is at least 2.25 mils thick.		

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1 "Single-use checkout bag":

- 2 (1)Means a bag made of plastic that is less than 2.25 3 mils thick, or a paper package or sack, whether 4 recyclable or non-recyclable, that is provided by a business to a customer, and is designed for one-time 5 use to contain and transport merchandise; and 6 7 (2) Does not include: 8 Bags used by customers inside a business to (A) 9 package loose items, such as fruits, vegetables, 10 nuts, grains, or candies, or small hardware 11 items; 12 (B) Bags used to contain or wrap frozen foods, meat 13 or fish, flowers or potted plants, or other items
- 15 (C) Bags used to protect or transport prepared foods16 or bakery goods;
- 17 (D) Bags provided by pharmacists to contain18 prescription medications;

to contain dampness;

- 19 (E) Newspaper bags;
- 20 (F) Door-hanger bags;

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1	(G)	Laundry or dry cleaning bags, including bags	
2		provided by hotels to guests to contain wet or	
3		dirty clothing;	
4	(H)	Bags sold in packages containing multiple bags	
5		intended for use as garbage, pet waste, or yard	
6		waste bags; or	
7	(I)	Bags used to contain live animals, such as fish	
8		or insects sold in pet stores.	
9	§342H-B	Distribution of single-use checkout bags; fee.	
10	(a) Beginning January 1, 2012, all businesses in the State		
11	shall charge and collect a fee of 5 cents for each single-use		
12	checkout bag t	hat is provided to customers.	
13	(b) Busi	nesses subject to the requirements of this part	
14	shall indicate	on each customer transaction receipt the number	
15	of single-use	checkout bags provided and the amount of the fee	
16	charged.		
17	(c) Noth	ing in this part shall preclude businesses from	
18	making reusable bags available for sale to customers.		
19	§342H-C	Remittance of fees. (a) Not later than the	
20	fifteenth day	of each month, each business subject to the	
21	requirements o	f this part shall remit to the department the fees	

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collected pursuant to section 342H-B during the immediately
 previous month.

3 (b) Payments and receipts of fees shall be reported on4 forms prescribed by the director.

5 (c) Businesses shall be subject to penalties and interest6 for late or underpaid fees.

7 (d) All fees collected by the department pursuant to this8 part shall be deposited into the general fund.

§ §342H-D violations. It shall be a violation of this part
for any business that is subject to the requirements of this
part to pay or otherwise reimburse a customer for any portion of
the fee required to be charged and collected pursuant to section
342H-B.

14 Violations of this part or any rule adopted pursuant to 15 this part shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$1,000 for 16 each violation.

17 §342H-E Preemption. Except for any county ordinance
18 regulating single-use checkout bags in effect prior to the
19 effective date of this part, this part shall preempt the powers
20 of any county to regulate the use of single-use checkout bags;
21 provided that in counties where an ordinance regulating single22 use checkout bags is in effect, the fee established under
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section 342H-B shall be applicable only to single-use checkout
 bags made of paper.

3 §342H-F Rules. The director shall adopt rules, pursuant
4 to chapter 91, as may be necessary for the purposes of this
5 part."

6 SECTION 2. In codifying the new sections added by section
7 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
8 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
9 the new sections in this Act.

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.

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Report Title:

Environmental Protection; Plastic Checkout Bags; Fee

Description:

Requires businesses in the State to collect a 5-cent fee for each single-use checkout bag provided to a customer. Allows for exemptions. Provides for fees to be deposited in the general fund. Requires fees to be collected on paper bags in counties that currently have ordinances banning plastic bags. Effective July 1, 2011. (HB998 HD1)
