HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO ESTABLISH A SPECIAL TASK FORCE TO INVESTIGATE THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR POSSIBLE VIOLATIONS OF THE HAWAII ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT OR THE SUNSHINE LAW.

WHEREAS, the State Health Planning and Development Agency
was established within the Department of Health to administer
state health planning and cost containment activities as
required by law; and

6 WHEREAS, the State Health Planning and Development Agency 7 administers the certificate of need program which provides that 8 no person shall enter into activities relating to a health care 9 facility or health care services unless the person is granted a 10 certificate of need from the State Health Planning and 11 Development Agency; and

13 WHEREAS, decisions by the State Health Planning and 14 Development Agency to issue a certificate of need are required 15 to be consistent with the state health services and facilities 16 plan, which are subject to adoption and amendment by the State 17 Health Planning and Development Agency under the laws regarding 18 public notice requirements; and

20 WHEREAS, reports have surfaced that the State Health 21 Planning and Development Agency may have violated the State's 22 open meetings and related laws in its approval of the state 23 health services and facilities plan and in its adoption of rules 24 relating to capacity thresholds; and

26 WHEREAS, as a consequence of these potential violations, 27 decisions on certificates of need may have been made under 28 administrative rules and a state health services and facilities 29 plan that were adopted in possible violation of the open 30 meetings and related laws; and

WHEREAS, these decisions of the State Health Planning and 2 3 Development Agency may have adversely affected the availability 4 of health care providers in the rural or underserved areas of 5 this State; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Attorney General is charged with enforcing chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, also known as the 8 Administrative Procedure Act and chapter 92, Hawaii Revised 9 10 Statutes, also known as the sunshine law or open meetings law; 11 now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Attorney General is requested to establish a special task force to investigate the 16 17 State Health Planning and Development Agency for possible violations of the Administrative Procedure Act, the sunshine 18 19 law, or both; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Attorney General is 21 requested to establish the size and composition of the special 22 task force to fairly represent all interested stakeholders and 23 24 to serve as its chairperson; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Attorney General is 27 requested to convene the special task force during the 28 legislative interim of 2011 and to terminate its proceedings on June 30, 2012; provided that its entire proceedings shall be 29 30 subject to chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Attorney General is further requested to submit a report of its findings and 33 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 34 35 Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 36 37

Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General,
the Director of Health, and the Administrator of the State
Health Planning and Development Agency.
