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1 2 (4) Residual responsibilities of the United States and the State of Hawai'i; and 3 4 5 (5) Grievances regarding assertions of historical wrongs 6 committed against Native Hawaiians by the United 7 States or by the State of Hawai'i; and 8 9 WHEREAS, these post-federal-recognition negotiations may result in recommendations by the parties for amendments to State 10 of Hawai'i and federal law; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, these post-federal-recognition negotiations and any resulting recommendations for amending state and federal law 14 15 will likely not occur until a considerable time passes, perhaps years, after enactment of the Native Hawaiian Government 16 17 Reorganization Act; and 18 19 WHEREAS, a more immediate concern exists as to whether 20 amendments to state and federal law may also be needed soon after the enactment of the Native Hawaiian Government 21 Reorganization Act to facilitate the process of establishing and 22 achieving federal recognition of a Native Hawaiian governing 23 24 entity that will later negotiate with the state and federal 25 governments; and 26 WHEREAS, with regard to state law, a study under the 27 28 auspices of the Hawai'i State Legislature would be most helpful 29 in identifying the state laws that may need amendment soon after enactment of the Native Hawaiian Government Reorganization Act; 30 31 and 32 WHEREAS, the Legislative Reference Bureau, with its 33 extensive background, knowledge, and publications regarding 34 state law, state policy, and the legislative process, is well-35 36 positioned and well-qualified to perform the study; now, therefore; 37 38 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 39 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular 40 Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative 41 Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study of State of 42 Hawai'i laws that may need amendment to facilitate the process 43 under the Native Hawaiian Government Reorganization Act of 44 2

22 23 24 25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to include the following in the report of its study:

32 33 34	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to consult closely with the Office of Hawaiian Affairs when planning and conducting the study; and			
35 36 37	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all government agencies are requested to provide their full cooperation and all relevant			
38 39 40	data and other information to the Legislative Reference Bureau during the planning and implementation of the study; and			
41 42 43 44	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit, not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012, its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation; and			
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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the United States Secretary of the Interior, the Acting Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau, and the Chairperson of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.
