HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING ALL HAWAII HIGH SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE CLASSES.

WHEREAS, Article XV, section 4, of the Hawaii State 1 Constitution establishes the Hawaiian language ('olelo Hawai'i) 2 3 as one of the two official languages of the State; and 4 WHEREAS, 'olelo Hawai'i is the only language in the United 5 States that is officially recognized at the state level; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the designation of Hawaiian as an official 9 language of the State paved the way for the creation of Hawaiian 10 language revitalization programs, such as 'Aha Punana Leo and Ke Kula Kaiapuni Hawai'i; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the success of the 'Aha Punana Leo and Ke Kula Kaiapuni Hawai'i programs have created a new generation of 14 speakers of 'olelo Hawai'i and increased the use and visibility 15 of 'olelo Hawai'i throughout the State; and 16 17 WHEREAS, 'olelo Hawai'i is a defining feature of the 18 Hawaiian culture and a major part of what makes Hawai'i unique; 19 20 and 21 WHEREAS, knowledge of 'olelo Hawai'i fosters a sense of 22 community and helps one to identify more closely with traditions 23 and values of Hawai'i; and 24 25 WHEREAS, access to 'olelo Hawai'i classes through the public 26 27 school system would allow this knowledge to reach a broader section of the population in a cost-effective manner; now, 28 29 therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twentysixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education is 3 urged to support any: 4 5 6 Public high school in offering 'olelo Hawai'i classes; (1)7 and 8 9 (2) Public elementary and middle or intermediate schools that teach 'olelo Hawai'i through Hawaiian culture, 10 11 arts, and dance as part of the social-studies curriculum; 12 13 14 and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Department of Education is 17 urged to allow kupuna to teach 'olelo Hawai'i and Hawaiian culture, arts, and dance in public schools; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all private high schools are 21 highly encouraged to offer 'olelo Hawai'i classes at their 22 respective institutions; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of the Board of 26 27 Education, and Executive Director of the Hawaii Association of 28 Independent Schools.
