## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO REPORT ON EARLY INTERVENTION STRATEGIES AND RESOURCES TO MITIGATE ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOR AND AVERT INCARCERATION AND RECIDIVISM AMONG NATIVE HAWAIIANS.

WHEREAS, there is a concern for the health and welfare of 1 2 native Hawaiian inmates in prisons in Hawaii and the continental 3 United States; and 4 WHEREAS, due to a number of historic and socioeconomic 5 factors, native Hawaiians make up a disproportionately high 6 percentage of the inmate population in the state prison system, 7 accounting for 24 percent of the overall state population but 39 8 percent of the incarcerated population; and 9 10 WHEREAS, in response to those concerns, the Office of 11 Hawaiian Affairs, in collaboration with public and private 12 entities, published a report entitled "The Disparate Treatment 13 of Native Hawaiians in the Criminal Justice System" in September 14 2010; and 15 16 WHEREAS, this report found that, when controlled for all 17 18 factors except ethnicity, native Hawaiians face disparate treatment in the Hawaii criminal justice system in many areas, 19 including longer prison sentences, probations, and a higher 20 percentage of parole revocations; and 21 22 WHEREAS, as detailed in the report, two of the key factors 23 that contribute to recidivism are a lack of standard and 24 culturally-based programs in prison to adequately prepare an 25 inmate for reentry into society; and 26 27 WHEREAS, early intervention strategies and resources 28 mitigate antisocial behavior and avert incarceration and 29 recidivism by serving as positive and effective influences 30 through their emphasis on coping and self-efficacy skills, 31 HCR116 HD1 HMS 2011-3382

positive behavioral interventions, education and training, and
 coordinated services at home, at school, and in the community;
 now, therefore,

5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 6 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 7 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Office of Hawaiian 8 Affairs is requested to convene a task force to produce a 9 comprehensive report on early intervention strategies and 10 resources needed to mitigate antisocial behavior and avert 11 incarceration and recidivism among native Hawaiians; and 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs submit the report to the Governor and the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director
of Public Safety, and Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of
the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.
