HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING AN AUDIT OF THE EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

1 2	WHEREAS, the Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund ("EUTF") provides health benefits for state and county employees
3	and their dependents; and
4	WWWDDD d the contributions by the State and counting to the

20	WHEREAS, the data display the magnitude of the benefits
22	cost increases for the EUTF increases which may consume
23	greater proportions of the State's operating budget in the
24	future; and
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 26	WHEREAS, moreover, according to the report, State of Hawaii
27	Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the Fiscal Year Ended
28	June 30, 2009, the unfunded actuarial accrued liability of the
29	EUTF for employees other than teachers was \$7,100,000,000 on
30	July 1, 2007; and
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WHEREAS, the unfunded actuarial accrued liability for 1 teachers was \$1,500,000,000 on the same date; and 2 3 WHEREAS, clearly, the costs of and contributions to the 4 EUTF must be moderated; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that an audit is a necessary 7 step in the process to ascertain the most effective and fair 8 approaches to achieve the moderation; now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-Sixth Legislature, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate 12 concurring, that the Auditor is requested to conduct a 13 14 management audit of the Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is also requested 17 to review the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund 18 laws, rules, and policies to determine changes that may moderate 19 contribution increases in a manner fair to public employers, 20 public employees, and dependent-beneficiaries; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is also requested 23 to study the management structure of the Employer-Union Health 24 Benefits Trust Fund, particularly the composition, voting 25 method, and fiduciary duty of the Board of Trustees, and 26 27 recommend changes for effectiveness, efficiency, or clarity; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is also requested 29 to recommend methods to gradually decrease the Employer-Union 30 Health Benefits Trust Fund's unfunded actuarial accrued 31 liability to comply with any General Accounting Standards Board 32 standard; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested not to address or recommend any change that would diminish the 36 Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund benefits of public 37 employees who retired before July 1, 2011, except that the 38 Auditor may recommend the elimination of any Employer-Union 39 Health Benefits Trust Fund health benefits for retirees that are 40 duplicative of Medicare; and 41 42



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 1 submit the audit, with recommended statutory changes, to the 2 Legislature by the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Employer-Union 7 Health Benefits Trust Fund. 8 9 10
