HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO APPROVE THE UNITED STATES-KOREA TRADE AGREEMENT.

1 WHEREAS, the recent economic recession has resulted in a 2 significant decline in the financial stability of families 3 across the country, with increasing unemployment rates that have 4 failed to rebound despite a tentative economic recovery; and 5

6 WHEREAS, one of the primary factors that generates a 7 sustainable economic recovery is job creation, which can be 8 accomplished by seizing available opportunities to expand into 9 receptive foreign markets; and

11 WHEREAS, according to the International Trade 12 Administration, free trade agreements are arguably one of the 13 best ways to open foreign markets to American exporters, often 14 resulting in a much more favorable trade balance for the United 15 States and a concomitant increase in job creation; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2010, President Obama announced the
successful resolution of outstanding issues with the United
States-Korea Trade Agreement, originally signed between the
United States and Republic of Korea on June 30, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the United States-Korea Trade Agreement would eliminate tariffs on over 95 percent of industrial and consumer goods, including agricultural products, within five years, which is expected to increase exports of American goods by \$10 to \$11 billion; and

WHEREAS, the United States is already the Republic of Korea's top supplier of agricultural products with many of those products originating with Hawaii's farmers and ranchers, and the United States-Korea Trade Agreement is expected to provide American agricultural producers with increased market access not

only by eliminating tariffs charged when United States exports arrive in the Republic of Korea, but also by establishing a framework to tackle additional barriers to United States exports; and

6 WHEREAS, the Republic of Korea has also agreed to match the 7 high level of openness exhibited by the United States in a 8 variety of service sectors, including energy and environmental 9 services, where Hawaii-based businesses may exercise a 10 competitive advantage; and

WHEREAS, provisions in the United States-Korea Trade Agreement on cross-border services, telecommunications, and electronic commerce are expected to offer advantages to the United States information and communications technology service sector, which is expected to benefit small-and medium-sized American enterprises that currently lack the resources to establish an office in every market they serve; and

20 WHEREAS, as the first United States free trade agreement 21 with a North Asian partner, the United States-Korea Trade 22 Agreement can serve as a model for trade agreements with other 23 countries in the region and underscore the United States' 24 commitment to, and engagement in, the Asia-Pacific Region; now, 25 therefore,

27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 28 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 29 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the United States Congress 30 is urged to approve the United States-Korea Trade Agreement; and 31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Hawaii's 34 congressional delegation, President Pro Tempore of the United 35 States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of 36 Representatives, and United States Trade Representative.
