HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO ASSESS, IMPOSE, LEVY, AND COLLECT AN ADDITIONAL FIVE PERCENT IMPACT FEE ON THE DEVELOPMENT COST OF HOUSING UNITS PRICED AT OR ABOVE \$700,000 TO BE DEPOSITED INTO A SPECIAL FUND TO DEVELOP PARKS FOR HOMELESS PERSONS.

1 WHEREAS, in spite of efforts by governments and nonprofit 2 organizations to provide overnight shelter to homeless persons, 3 many do not use homeless shelters due to mental illness, drug 4 addiction, an inability to conform to shelter rules, or other 5 reasons; and

7 WHEREAS, there are still many homeless persons who sleep in 8 parks, along sidewalks, and other public areas; and 9

10 WHEREAS, homeless persons who sleep in public areas create 11 a grave concern for the State, particularly for the vital 12 visitor industry; and

14 WHEREAS, funding is needed to establish new parks or 15 designate existing parks for use by homeless persons; now, 16 therefore,

18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 19 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that in addition to current 20 impact fees authorized under section 46-142, Hawaii Revised 21 Statutes, the counties are urged to assess, impose, levy, and 22 collect additional impact fees in the amount of five percent of 23 the cost of development of single, duplex, or multi-family 24 25 housing units that are priced at or above \$700,000 to be deposited into a special fund for use by the Hawaii Public 26 Housing Authority to develop parks for homeless persons; and 27
