HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE FEDERAL 2008 FARM BILL AMENDMENT TO THE RICHARD B. RUSSELL NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH ACT.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Education is a large purchaser of food products for Child Nutrition Programs including the 2 School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program, 3 4 Afterschool Snack Program, and Summer Food Service Program; and 5 6 WHEREAS, as a large purchaser of food products, the 7 Department of Education can make a significant impact on the 8 local economy by purchasing produce from local farms; and 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii's schoolchildren will benefit from the 10 purchase of local produce by consuming fresher, better tasting, 11 12 and more nutritious food; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the procurement of produce from local farms can also serve as a "market primer" by representing a stable source 15 of demand for local farmers, thereby creating the security 16 required for these farmers to invest in the capital necessary to 17 expand production capacity and access additional markets; and 18 19 WHEREAS, since the cost of agricultural production in 20 Hawaii is high compared to many states due to the high cost of 21 land coupled with the high cost of importing necessary 22 production supplies such as fuel, fertilizer, feed, and packing 23 materials, local farms have difficulty competing for Department 24 of Education Child Nutrition Program Contracts; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the 2008 Farm Bill amended the National School Lunch Act to allow states participating in federal Child 28 Nutrition Programs to apply a geographic preference for locally 29 grown or locally raised agricultural products; and 30

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WHEREAS, while the geographic preference may not inhibit 1 free and open competition, federal regulations do not prescribe 2 3 the number of preference points or maximum price percentage that may be assigned to geographic preference as long as the 4 5 application of the geographic preference option leaves an 6 appropriate number of qualified firms to compete for a contract; 7 and 8 9 WHEREAS, the application of a geographic preference for 10 local farmers will help them bid competitively on Child 11 Nutrition Program contracts to the benefit of schoolchildren and the State economy as a whole; now, therefore, 12 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 16 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Agriculture is requested to convene a working group to examine 17 18 the federal 2008 Farm Bill amendment to the Richard B. Russell 19 National School Lunch Act; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group consist of the following members: 22 23 24 (1)A representative from the Department of Agriculture 25 with knowledge of Child Nutrition Programs procurement; 26 27 A representative from the Department of Education with 28 (2)knowledge of Child Nutrition Programs procurement; 29 30 (3) A representative from the State Procurement Office 31 with knowledge of Child Nutrition Programs 32 procurement; 33 34 35 (4) A representative from the Kokua Hawaii Foundation; 36 37 (5) A representative from the Hawaii School Garden Network; and 38 39 (6) A representative from Ma'o Organic Farms; and 40 41 42 and 43

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group, at minimum: 2 3 Determine an appropriate geographic preference (1)4 percentage rate that maintains fair competition to be 5 used by the Department of Education; 6 7 (2)Identify barriers preventing the Department of 8 Education from using local produce, including state 9 menu planning requirements, food and farm safety 10 certifications, seasonal availability, local industry 11 volatility, production limitations, and United States 12 Department of Agriculture contracting requirements and procedures; 13 14 15 (3) Explore methods and mechanisms to reduce barriers to the Department of Education's use of local produce in 16 Child Nutrition Programs; 17 18 (4) Identify ways to assist local farms to become more 19 competitive for the Department of Education 20 procurement process; and 21 22 (5) Identify existing successful partnerships between the 23 24 Department of Education and farms that encourage local 25 agriculture and use them as a model for other schools and farms; 26 27 28 and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that working group is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the 31 32 Legislature, Department of Agriculture, and Department of Education no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the 33 Regular Session of 2012; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 36 37 to ensure that its findings and recommendations are disseminated to school procurement officers and local farmers; and 38

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Directors of Education and Agriculture, and the State Procurement Office.
