HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATURE TO BROADCAST MORE LEGISLATIVE PROCEEDINGS AND POST THEM ON THE LEGISLATIVE WEBSITE.

WHEREAS, transparency promotes accountability and provides 1 2 information for citizens about what their government is doing on their behalf; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, transparency is government's obligation to share information with citizens, while providing the people the 6 opportunity to tell their elected officials what they think of a 7 8 particular piece of legislation, before it comes up for a vote; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, a more transparent government begins with public 11 engagement which enhances the government's effectiveness and 12 13 improves the quality of its decisions; and 14 WHEREAS, without the ability to watch legislative hearings 15 and floor sessions, a huge segment of our population is excluded 16 from observing the legislative process; and 17 18 WHEREAS, with fewer newspapers and TV news outlets in our 19 state, there is reduced news coverage pertaining to the 20 21 legislature, making citizens further removed from the 22 legislative process; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the legislature has the opportunity to address the lack of transparency and public participation by using the 25 technology we have at our disposal today through video, 26 webcasting, and audio transmission to the public; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, for our democracy to work properly, citizens are making every effort to stay more closely informed and engaged 30 than ever before to engage in and become more involved in the 31 32 political processes; and

1 2 WHEREAS, anyone that has the capability to view or monitor government proceedings can easily keep informed and be able to 3 voice their approval or objection via email or post on a website 4 5 or blog a link to a precise segment of a particular hearing or floor session; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, broadcasting hearings and floor sessions will allow all interested citizens and stakeholders to evaluate, 9 10 scrutinize, or support their elected officials' work at their discretion; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, although the House of Representatives and Senate broadcasts selected hearings to the public, only the Senate 14 makes the broadcast available on-demand on the legislature's 15 website; now, therefore, 16 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 19 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the legislature is 20 21 requested to broadcast video or transmit audio of committee 22 hearings and floor sessions to the public; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the video or audio transmission be made available on the legislature's website for future 25 26 viewing; and 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Speaker of the House 29 of Representatives, the Senate President, and the respective 30 leaders of the House and Senate Majority caucuses. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY:
