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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT THE REAUTHORIZATION OF THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN EDUCATION ACT.

WHEREAS, the Native Hawaiian Education Act was preceded by 1 legislation in the Augustus F. Hawkins-Robert Stafford 2 Elementary and Secondary School Improvement Amendments of 1988, 3 to authorize and develop supplemental educational programs to 4 address the unique conditions of Native Hawaiians; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Native Hawaiian Education Act was first 7 enacted under the Improving America's Schools Act of 1994, 8 reauthorized under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, and is 9 slated to be reauthorized under the Blueprint for Reform of the 10 Elementary and Secondary Education Act; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Native Hawaiian Education Act's findings 13 established declarations that have been cited in significant 14 legal decisions concerning Native Hawaiians; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the first demonstration program to provide higher 17 education fellowship assistance to Native Hawaiians has resulted 18 19 in increased scholarships for Native Hawaiians; and 20 WHEREAS, the first demonstration program to develop family-21 based education centers throughout the Hawaiian islands resulted 22 in the growth of 'Aha Punana Leo preschools statewide to further 23 meet the needs of families desiring to perpetuate the Hawaiian 24 language as a living language; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the first demonstration program to establish the Center for Gifted and Talented Native Hawaiian Children at the 28 29 University of Hawai'i at Hilo resulted in the growth of the Na Pua No'eau program statewide to further meet the special needs of 30 gifted and talented Hawaiian students; and 31 32

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1 WHEREAS, the first demonstration program authorized grants 2 to address the special education needs of Native Hawaiian students and those grants resulted in exemplary programs such as 3 4 Pihana Na Mamo that assisted special needs Native Hawaiian students at succeeding in school; and 5 6 .7 WHEREAS, subsequent grants by the United States Secretary of Education under the Native Hawaiian Education Act have 8 9 resulted in an increase in Native Hawaiian language curriculum 10 development and indigenous teacher preparation programs, community-based education learning centers, and the 11 12 establishment of the Native Hawaiian Education Council and island councils; and 13 14 WHEREAS, President Obama has reaffirmed his 15 16 Administration's commitment to Native Hawaiian education through the federal fiscal year 2012 budget request and the Blueprint 17 18 for Reform of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the policies of the Native Hawaiian Education Act, as contained in the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, and 21 incorporated in the Blueprint for Reform of the Elementary and 22 23 Secondary Education Act, will also be considered for 24 reauthorization; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 27 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that Hawaii's congressional 28 29 delegation is urged to support the reauthorization of the policies of the Native Hawaiian Education Act; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Hawaii's Congressional Delegation, Chairperson of the Board of Education, and Office of 34 35 Hawaiian Affairs. 36 37 38 OFFERED BY:
