## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CREATION OF THE LUPUS AWARENESS TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, lupus is an urgent national health issue; and 1 2 WHEREAS, lupus results from an unbalanced immune system and 3 can become destructive to any organ in the body; and 4 5 WHEREAS, lupus is unpredictable and potentially fatal, yet 6 7 no satisfactory treatment exists; and 8 WHEREAS, its health consequences include disfiguring 9 rashes, scarring, disabling arthritis, heart attacks, strokes, 10 11 seizures, and organ failure; and 12 WHEREAS, misdiagnosis of lupus commonly occurs, resulting 13 in needless suffering, denial of health or life insurance, and 14 15 higher premiums for health insurance; and 16 WHEREAS, national data indicate that more than 1,500,000 17 Americans suffer from lupus and, according to Lupus Hawaii, over 18 10,000 people in Hawaii are affected by lupus; and 19 20 WHEREAS, although recommendations have been made, no new 21 drugs to specifically to treat lupus have been approved by the 22 Food and Drug Administration in the last fifty years; and 23 24 WHEREAS, while current treatments for the disease may be 25 effective, they have side effects that often prove worse than 26 the disease itself; and 27 28 WHEREAS, annually, lupus treatment costs the nation in 29 excess of \$31,400,000,000; now, therefore, 30 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 33 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is 34

1 requested to create the Lupus Awareness Task Force to promote public and health professional education and awareness of lupus 2 among public health and human services officials, physicians, 3 nurses, and other health care providers and increase knowledge 4 concerning the causes and consequences of lupus, the importance 5 6 of early diagnosis and appropriate management, and effective 7 treatment and management strategies; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lupus Awareness Task Force develop a comprehensive plan to improve lupus education and 10 awareness in the State; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the comprehensive plan focus on 13 14 minority populations and at-risk communities to raise public awareness, educate consumers, and educate and train health 15 professionals, human service providers, and other audiences; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lupus Awareness Task Force consider at minimum the following activities in the 19 comprehensive plan: 20 21 Distributing medically-sound health information 22 (1)produced by national organizations and government 23 agencies that deal with lupus, such as the National 24 Institutes of Health, the Centers for Disease Control 25 and Prevention, the Arthritis Foundation, the American 26 College of Rheumatology, the Lupus Foundation, and the 27 Social Security Administration, through county health 28 departments, physicians and other health 29 professionals, hospitals, health insurers and health 30 maintenance organizations, women's health programs, 31 and nonprofit and community-based organizations; 32 33 Developing educational materials for health (2)34 professionals that identify the latest scientific and 35 medical information and clinical applications; 36 37 (3) Increasing knowledge among physicians, nurses, and 38 health and human services professionals about the 39 importance of lupus diagnosis, treatment, and 40 rehabilitation; 41 42

(4) Supporting continuing medical education programs in 1 the State by providing up-to-date information about 2 3 lupus and lupus research; 4 Providing the latest information on clinical advances 5 (5) through statewide workshops and seminars to promote 6 in-depth professional development among health care 7 providers regarding the care and management of lupus 8 patients; and 9 10 Developing, maintaining, and disseminating a directory (6) 11 of lupus-related services and lupus health care 12 specialist providers who diagnose and treat lupus; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lupus Awareness Task Force 15 be composed of seven members to be designated by the Director of 16 Health and that the members have lupus-related experience and 17 include representatives from relevant state agencies; scientists 18 with experience in lupus research; health and medical 19 professionals with experience treating lupus patients; 20 representatives from non-profit women's and health 21 organizations, including Lupus Hawaii; and individuals with 22 lupus; and 23 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Lupus Awareness Task Force designate a chair from among its members 26 and serve without compensation but be reimbursed for travel 27 expenses necessary to carry out their duties; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is 30 requested to submit the Lupus Awareness Task Force's 31 comprehensive plan to the Legislature no later than twenty days 32 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 33 34
