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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING A FLOOD CONTROL TASK FORCE TO EXPLORE THE CHALLENGES OF FLOOD CONTROL.

1	WHEREAS, most scientists recognize that global weather and
2	climate patterns are changing, including a steady and marked
3	rise in land and ocean temperatures; and
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5	WHEREAS, Hawaii is not impervious to a changing climate;

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8	WHEREAS, one of the major results of global warming is that
9	natural disasters are magnified in intensity and
10	destructiveness; and
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12	WHEREAS, flooding has become more severe around the world,
13	including in Hawaii; and
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15	WHEREAS, flooding can result from overflowing rivers and
16	streams triggered by excessive rainfall as well as ocean surges
17	caused by tropical cyclones, such as tropical storms and
18	hurricanes; and
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20	WHEREAS, the windward side of Oahu is particularly
21	vulnerable to flooding and the damage to homes, businesses, and
22	property that accompanies flooding; and
23	1 1 1 1 state of Leobarry, and
24	WHEREAS, it is important to ascertain and develop methods
25	to mitigate the effects of flooding and the damage it causes;
26	now, therefore,
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28	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
29	Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
30	of 2011, the Senate concurring, that a Flood Control Task Force
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1 is established to review and study the challenges of flood 2 control; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Flood Control Task Force 5 (Task Force) be composed of: 6 7 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, or the Chairperson's designee, who will 8 9 serve as Chairperson of the Task Force; 10 (2) The Vice Director of Civil Defense, or the Vice 11 Director's designee; and 12 13 Scientists from the University of Hawaii, including 14 (3) 15 climatologists, geologists, and other experts in ocean, earth, and environmental sciences; 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force include Windward 19 Oahu in its review and study; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force include in its 22 review and study: 23 (1)The phenomenon of flooding, particularly in relation 24 to changes in climate and weather patterns and a rise 25 26 in sea levels; 27 28 (2) Methods to mitigate flooding and ways to improve flood control; and 29 30 (3) Ways to mitigate damage to homes, businesses, and 31 property caused by flooding; 32 33 34 and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force submit its 36 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 37 legislation, to the Legislature no later than 20 days before the 38 39 convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 40

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to assist the Task Force in preparing its report and any proposed legislation; provided that the Chairperson of the Task Force submit a draft of the Task Force's proposals to the Legislative Reference Bureau for drafting no later than November 1, 2011;

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 10 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Adjutant 11 General, the Board of Regents and President of the University of 12 Hawaii, and the Acting Director of the Legislative Reference 13 Bureau.
