HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO FORM A TASK FORCE TO INITIATE THE PLANNING AND DESIGN PROCESS TO DEVELOP A CORRECTIONAL TREATMENT FACILITY TO HOUSE ONE THOUSAND TO ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED INMATES ON UNDEVELOPED HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the State can no longer afford to postpone the 1 construction of correctional facilities in the State; and 2 3 WHEREAS, prison overcrowding places the State in a 4 vulnerable position of being subject to charges of civil rights 5 violations and security risks; and 6 7 WHEREAS, since 1995, the Department of Public Safety has 8 transported prisoners to facilities in other states, including 9 Oklahoma, Texas, Oregon, Minnesota, Arizona, and Tennessee, 10 based on the premise that such transport is a temporary solution 11 until adequate facilities are built in Hawaii and that the State 12 cannot afford to transport inmates to mainland facilities 13 indefinitely; and 14 15 WHEREAS, out-of-state placements cost approximately 16 \$24,400,000 per year, or \$56 per prisoner per day for care, 17 custody, transportation, inmate compensation, and health care; 18 and 19 20 WHEREAS, the arrangement has not been problem-free because, 21

at the mainland facilities, there have been allegations of sexual assault of female prisoners, denial of timely medical treatment, and civil rights violations, and furthermore, the lack of nearby family support, which is an integral part of any successful re-entry into local society, hinders rehabilitation; and

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by the State were convicted of crimes relating to drug laws or 2 other crimes to support drug habits so that simple incarceration 3 without treatment will only lead to recidivism and magnify the 4 problem rather than lead to a reduction of the scourge of drug 5 and substance abuse; and 6 7 WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to build a new 8 correctional facility that emphasizes programs to treat 9 substance abuse and mental health issues and is designed to 10 house one thousand to one thousand two hundred inmates and 11 provide them with intensive drug- and substance-abuse and other 12 mental health treatment; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a possible site for a new correctional treatment 15 per cent of prisoners are of Hawaiian facility, given that 16 ancestry, may be undeveloped Department of Hawaiian Home Lands 17 property on the Big Island, although other sites that may be 18 more appropriate or economically feasible should also be 19 considered; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 23 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Director of Public 24 Safety is requested to form a task force comprised of elected 25 and administrative state and county officials and community 26 27 leaders to include but not be limited to: 28 The Director of Public Safety or a designee; (1)29

WHEREAS, the great majority of all prisoners incarcerated

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(5) The Director of Research and Development of the County 1 2 of Hawaii or a designee; and 3 (6) A representative of the Hawaiian home lands 4 5 beneficiary community; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to initiate the planning and design process to develop a 8 correctional treatment facility to house one thousand to one 9 thousand two hundred inmates on undeveloped Hawaiian home lands 10 property on the Big Island, or other appropriate site, as 11 12 proposed by the Director of Public Safety; and 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 14 consider the planning and design of a secure correctional 15 facility that provides intensive in-house rehabilitation 16 programs for the treatment of chemical dependency and abuse and 17 other mental health problems; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to consider a correctional treatment facility designed to be 21 operated by the State or a private operator with the ability to 22 provide a total continuum of care programs that address 23 education, prevention, treatment, and supervision services 24 25 following an offender's reentry into the community and that are designed to achieve the prevention of drug and substance abuse 26 and the resolution of other mental health problems; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 29 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 30 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later than 31 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 32 33 2012; and 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 35 include the following in its report: 36 37 (1)The preliminary design and projected cost of the 38 correctional treatment facility, which shall be 39

17 18 19 20 21	(4)	Should the facility be constructed and operated by the same private entity, a draft request for proposals for the development and operation of the facility under the respective requirements of paragraphs (2) and (3);
22 23 24 25 26 27 28	(5)	A prioritized list of suitable sites, including other public lands and private properties, along with the estimated cost of acquisition, the costs for site preparation, and the cost for the provision of all necessary infrastructure to support the proposed facility;
29 30 31 32 33 34 35	(6)	A proposal for financing the acquisition of the completed turn-key facility, including the use of general obligation bonds, special purpose revenue bonds, tax-exempted project revenue bonds, certificates of participation, or other forms of financing; and
36 37 38 39	(7)	Any proposed legislation required for the implementation of the final design, construction, purchase, and operation of the correctional treatment facility; and



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
