## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO GATHER STATISTICS ON INJURIES INVOLVING MOTORCYCLES, MOPEDS, BICYCLES AND ATV'S WITHOUT HELMETS IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that persons who operate 1 motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles and ATV's while using a helmet are 2 less likely to suffer severe injuries; and 3 4 WHEREAS, a study done by the National Highway Traffic 5 Safety Administration collecting data on motorcycle injuries 6 from 18 states during the period of 2003-2005 (DOT HS 811 208, 7 October, 2009) revealed that those riders using helmets were 8 less likely to experience facial and head injuries and 9 significantly less likely to experience Traumatic Brain Injury 10 (TBI); and 11 12 WHEREAS, 56.8 percent of the riders in the study wore 13 helmets and 43.2 percent did not wear a helmet; and 14 15 WHEREAS, 7.3 percent of those not wearing a helmet suffered 16 Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) while 4.7 percent of those who did 17 wear a helmet suffered TBI; and 18 19 WHEREAS, 78.7 percent of those not wearing a helmet did not 20 suffer TBI while 85.5 percent of those wearing a helmet did not 21 suffer TBI; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Legislature similarly finds that helmets 24 provide a safety mechanism for those on mopeds, bicycles and 25 ATV's as well; and 26 27 WHEREAS, according to an article: Traffic Safety Facts 28 Laws: Bicycle Helmet Use Laws, April 2004, put out by the 29 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), in 2002, 30

treated for emergency room injuries from bicycles; and

8 WHEREAS, also in the article, the NHTSA finds that as of 9 2002, 20 states (including the District of Columbia) have 10 enacted bicycle helmet laws for children; now, therefore, 11

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 12 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 13 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health, 14 Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention Systems Branch 15 is requested to gather statistics on injuries involving helmet 16 use for motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles and ATV's and report to 17 the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of 18 the Regular Session of 2012; and 19

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Department of 23 Health, Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention Systems 24 Branch, the Speaker of the House, and the President of the 25 Senate.
