REQUESTING THE LEGISLATURE TO EXPLORE THE OPTIONS OF TELECOMMUNICATING FOR COMMITTEE HEARINGS.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Hawaii is a state comprised of multiple islands of which more than 400,000 people live outside the island of Oahu; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, testifying in Legislative hearings requires neighbor island residents to purchase airfare to Oahu often at less than 48 hour notice, in order to appear at the State Capitol; and
10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, this travel creates a financial hardship, often an insurmountable obstacle, to those individuals wishing to testify, often resulting in the exclusion of a third of the state population from the legislative process; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, new technology allows for teleconferencing at points on the neighbor islands which can be viewed at the capitol by committee members without requiring travel; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, this new technology would provide increased opportunity for constituent input from neighbor island residents; now, therefore,
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Sergeant at Arms Offices of both the House and Senate report on the feasibility of creating a telecommunication system which allows neighbor island residents to testify from their home island via telecommuting; and
30 31 32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report also consider the current cost of testifying to neighbor island residents; and
