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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE CURRENT LAW AND PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE DISPOSITION OF VACATION CREDITS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYEES THAT TRANSFER TO ANOTHER DEPARTMENT IN THE SAME JURISDICTION OR TO ANOTHER JURISDICTION.

WHEREAS, section 78-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, contains
provisions relating to leaves of absence for public employees;
and

5 WHEREAS, currently, when a public employee is transferred 6 from one department to another within the same jurisdiction or 7 to another jurisdiction of the State, the employee must be given 8 credit for vacation earned or accumulated in the department from 9 which the employee transferred and the Director of Finance, or 10 equivalent officer, is required to transfer the appropriate 11 amount of funds to effect the employee transfer; and

WHEREAS, if the state agency from which the employee transferred is financed by the general fund, the amount representing vacation earned is transferred to the general fund, rather than the agency receiving the employee; and

18 WHEREAS, this process results in problems for the agencies19 involved in the transfer; and

21 WHEREAS, the agency from which the public employee 22 transferred incurs substantial costs to cover the vacation 23 credits; and

25 WHEREAS, in cases where the receiving state agency is 26 financed by the general fund, the transferred funds are not 27 credited to that agency and, instead, are transferred to the 28 general fund; and

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1 WHEREAS, questions have arisen as to the rationale for this 2 procedure, and whether a more equitable process is available with respect to the disposition of vacation credits; now, 3 4 therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 8 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative Reference 9 Bureau is requested to conduct a study on the current law and procedures relating to the disposition of vacation credits for 10 public employees that transfer from one department to another in 11 the same jurisdiction or transfer to another jurisdiction, 12 including a review of the legislative history of the current 13 law; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau assess and determine the rationale for, and soundness of, 17 the current law and procedures, and to offer viable 18 alternatives; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in conducting the study, the 21 22 Legislative Reference Bureau conduct a survey of the personnel 23 directors of the State Executive Branch, State House of Representatives, State Senate, State Judiciary, executive 24 branches of the counties, and legislative branches of the 25 26 counties, on whether problems have been experienced with the 27 disposition of vacation credits for transferring employees and 28 what recommendations the personnel directors have for improving 29 the system; and 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 31 32 Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior 33 34 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Acting Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Acting Director of the 38 39 Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to send copies of this Concurrent Resolution to the personnel directors of the State 40 Executive Branch, State House of Representatives, State Senate, 41 State Judiciary, executive branches of the counties, and 42 43 legislative branches of the counties.

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
