## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING FAMILIES THAT EXPERIENCE BULLYING IN THE HOME TO SEEK COUNSELING AND THE JUDICIARY TO REQUIRE COUNSELING FOR THOSE CONVICTED OF A CRIME WHOSE FACTS SUGGEST BULLYING.

WHEREAS, bullying has serious and lasting effects; and 1 2 3 WHEREAS, research has found that bullying has significant 4 effects for those who are bullied, those who bully others, and those who witness bullying; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, bullying increases the risk of depression and anxiety for victims and witnesses of bullying, and increases the 8 likelihood of criminal convictions for those who bully; and 9 10 WHEREAS, although less publicized, bullying often occurs in 11 the home between family members, and has the same debilitating 12 13 effects as bullying in school; and 14 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that counseling is an 15 effective and common sense approach to addressing the issue of 16 17 bullying in the home; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 20 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature urges 21 families that experience bullying in the home to seek counseling 22 23 to address the causes and adverse effects of bullying; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is urged to 25 require counseling for any person convicted of a crime whose 26 · facts suggest bullying, regardless of where the bullying occurs; 27 28 and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the
