HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ACCEPT THE NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACT COLLEGE ADMISSION EXAM RESULTS FOR DETERMINING IF A SCHOOL IS MEETING "NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND" COMPLIANCE.

1 WHEREAS, the ACT College Admission Exam is a national 2 college admission and placement exam in English, math, reading, 3 and science that is administered in all 50 states in the United 4 States including 22 percent of students in schools in the State 5 of Hawaii; and

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7 WHEREAS, the ACT College Admission Exam is recognized as 8 being a curriculum-based examination rather than an aptitude 9 test that directly relates to the content of what high school 10 students should be taught and provides students, their teachers, 11 and career counselors with a comprehensive profile of a 12 student's work; and

14 WHEREAS, Hawaii has been awarded competitive Race to the 15 Top Federal Grant funds in the amount of \$75 million to address 16 poor performing schools and has committed to a goal of ensuring 17 all Hawaii high school graduates are college and career ready 18 by school year 2017-2018; and

20 WHEREAS, as part of the Race to the Top obligations, the 21 State has committed to adopting the Common Core Curriculum in 22 math, English, and science being developed by the National 23 Governors Association in conjunction with the National 24 Association of Superintendents of Schools; and 25

26 WHEREAS, teachers and counselors who administer the Hawaii 27 State Assessment indicate that the costs of administering the 28 tests are high and the test results are not sufficiently timely 29 to provide feedback to teachers to adjust their lesson plans or

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for students to identify areas where they may need additional 1 2 study or tutoring; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Assessment requires a significant 5 expenditure of student learning time and teaching time to be 6 used for test preparation; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the ACT College Admission Exam is recognized and 9 accepted as a college entrance examination by colleges and universities throughout the United States; the costs of taking 10 11 the exam are relatively minor; and the results are available promptly for teachers, counselors, and students to use to adjust 12 13 their instruction, counseling, and learning patterns; now, therefore, 14 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 18 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that a letter be prepared by the Superintendent of Education to the United States Department of 19 20 Education and the United States Congress asking that states be allowed to accept ACT as a benchmark for determining compliance 21 22 by school districts for applicable grade levels with the 23 requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind Act; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 26 requested to review: 27 28 (1) Whether the ACT College Admission Exam will be an appropriate substitution for the Hawaii State 29 Assessment, including determining appropriate grade 30 31 levels for administration; and 32 (2) Any costs that may be associated with administering 33 34 the ACT College Admission Exam at various schools; 35 36 and 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 39 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the State Board of Education, Superintendent of 40 Education, members of the Hawaii Congressional Delegation, 41 United States Secretary of Education, and Principals of each 42 43 public high school in the State.

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
