HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING GOVERNMENT COLLABORATION WITH COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT METHODS OF IMPROVING THE PREVENTION OF TEENAGE PREGNANCIES.

WHEREAS, teenage mothers face significant challenges in 1 trying to provide for their children, with many less likely to 2 complete high school or obtain any post-secondary education; and 3 4 WHEREAS, many teenage mothers end up in poverty and reliant 5 on welfare, especially during the critically important 6 developmental years of the child; and 7 8 WHEREAS, by far the greatest harm from teenage pregnancy is 9 experienced by the children, who are at heightened risk of being 10 born prematurely or at low birth weight, raising their 11 probabilities of infant death, blindness, deafness, chronic 12 respiratory problems, mental retardation, mental illness, and 13 cerebral palsy; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, young parents are often less able to provide an environment for the early cognitive stimulation that a child 17 needs for adequate brain development and consequently; children 18 born to teenage mothers tend to do worse in school, are more 19 likely to repeat a grade, perform worse on standardized tests, 20 and are ultimately less likely to complete high school; and 21 22 WHEREAS, society pays a price for teenage childbearing 23 because children of teenage parents exhibit higher rates of 24 economic inactivity and crime, resulting in taxpayer costs 25 through lost tax revenues, public assistance expenditures, and 26 costs associated with health care, foster care, and criminal 27 justice; and 28 29 WHEREAS, teenage pregnancy prevention programs improve the 30 lives and future prospects of children and families and help 31

ensure that children are born into stable families that are
committed to and prepared for the demanding task of raising the
next generation; and

5 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Youth Services Network provides 6 training and technical assistance for teenage pregnancy 7 prevention programs; and

9 WHEREAS, a collaboration between public schools and youth-10 oriented, community-based programs can strengthen and expand 11 efforts to prevent teenage pregnancies; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education is requested to collaborate with the Hawaii Youth Services Network and other community-based organizations to develop and implement methods to improve the prevention of teenage pregnancies; and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 23 Board of Education, the Superintendent of Education, and the 24 Executive Director of the Hawaii Youth Services Network. 25
