HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A POWERBALL STATE LOTTERY.

1 WHEREAS, Powerball is an American lottery game sold in lotteries in member states across the country as a shared 2 3 jackpot pool game; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Powerball is coordinated by the Multi-State 6 Lottery Association, a non-profit organization entirely owned and operated by member lotteries and based in Des Moines, Iowa; 7 and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Powerball currently is available in the District of Columbia, the United States Virgin Islands, and forty-two 11 12 states: Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, 13 14 Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New 15 Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, 16 17 Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, 18 19 Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin; and 20 WHEREAS, Mega Millions is also a multistate lottery game 21 played in the District of Columbia and forty-one participating 22 states: Arkansas, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, 23 Delaware, Georgia, Iowa, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, 24 25 Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, North Carolina, Nebraska, North Dakota, New 26 Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, 27 Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South 28 Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, 29 30 Wisconsin, and West Virginia; and 31 32 WHEREAS, Hawaii is presently suffering from a severe

1 particularly in light of the Pacific tsunami disaster in Japan and its projected effects on tourism; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the National Conference of State Legislatures 5 reports that state lotteries sold \$53,700,000,000 worth of tickets in fiscal year 2006, which was equal to three percent of 6 the total state revenue generated by all of the participating 7 8 states during that year; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the State needs an alternative means to generate revenue in addition to taxes and should give due consideration 11 to the potential use of lotteries as a source of revenue 12 generation, as a majority of other states have done; now, 13 therefore, 14 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 18 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study on the feasibility of 19 implementing a Powerball, Mega Millions lottery, or both in the 20 21 State; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 24 Bureau report findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 25 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 29 30 Legislative Reference Bureau. 31 32 33 OFFERED BY:
