HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DECLARING 'A'A AS THE STATE ROCK.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, volcanoes have a deep and rich cultural significance to Native Hawaiians and current residents of the State; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, the majesty and beauty of volcanoes, both active and inactive, are enjoyed by residents and visitors alike; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, the Hawaiian islands are volcanic in origin; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, each Hawaiian island is made up of at least one primary volcano, although many islands are composites of more than one volcano; and
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, lava rock is expelled by volcanoes during eruptions; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, 'A'a is one of three basic types of lava rock and is characterized by a rough, jagged spinose, and generally clinkery surface; and
20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, 'A'a is the rarest of the three types of lava rock; now, therefore,
24 25 26 27 28 29	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature of the State of Hawaii declares 'A'a as the state rock to honor the creation of the State and the cultural significance thereof; and
