## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII ADVISORY COMMISSION ON DRUG ABUSE AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES TO DETERMINE WHETHER BATH SALTS, ALSO KNOWN AS MEPHEDRONE AND METHYLENEDIOXYPYROVALERONE, SHOULD BE DESIGNATED AS A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and 1 Controlled Substances, which is established under the Department 2 of Health for administrative purposes, is charged with the 3 responsibility of acting in an advisory capacity to the 4 5 Department of Public Safety relating to the scheduling of controlled substances, by recommending the addition, deletion, 6 or rescheduling of all substances designated as controlled 7 substances under the Uniform Controlled Substances Act; and 8 9

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is charged with the responsibility of submitting annual reports to the Legislature, three months prior to the convening of each regular session, with regard to additions, deletions, or revisions to the schedules of controlled substances under the Uniform Controlled Substances Act; and

WHEREAS, bath salts, or mephedrone and methylenedioxypyrovalerone, also known as MDPV, are currently not designated as controlled substances under any of the five schedules of controlled substances under the Uniform Controlled Substances Act; and

WHEREAS, bath salts are a synthetic designer drug, and theyare a stimulant; and

26 WHEREAS, bath salts are usually snorted or smoked, not 27 unlike cocaine or methamphetamine, and produce a high similar to 28 methamphetamines and sometimes violent behavior in users; and 29

1 WHEREAS, bath salts may cause hallucinations, paranoia, a rapid heart rate, and suicidal thoughts; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the White House Drug Czar Gil Kerlikowske issued a 5 written statement in February 2011, warning people about the dangers of taking bath salts; now, therefore, 6 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 9 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 10 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Advisory 11 Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances is requested to determine whether bath salts, also known as mephedrone and 12 methylenedioxypyrovalerone, should be designated as a controlled 13 substance; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety is requested to include in its mandatory annual report to the 17 Legislature its recommendation on whether bath salts, also known 18 19 as mephedrone and methylenedioxypyrovalerone, should be added to 20 any of the schedules of substances under the Uniform Controlled Substances Act; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Public Safety and the Chairperson of the Hawaii Advisory Commission on 25 Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances. 26 27 28 29
