## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY OPPORTUNITIES TO PROMOTE AND EXPAND HERITAGE TOURISM.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has a unique and culturally rich heritage 1 that can be found in its architecture, artifacts, oral and 2 written histories, music, dress, foods, and people; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, with nearly six-and-a-half million visitors a year from around the world who spend more than \$12,000,000,000 a 6 7 year, the visitor industry is the State's primary economic 8 driver; and 9 10 WHEREAS, one of the fastest developing segments of the visitor industry, Heritage Tourism, focuses on sharing Hawaii's 11 rich cultural diversity with visitors; and 12 13 WHEREAS, heritage tourism is a clean, low-impact, 14 15 ecologically sensitive way to grow and develop the visitor industry and strengthen Hawaii's economy; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has conducted various studies that find that tourists who visit 19 historic sites and cultural attractions stay longer and spend an 20 21 average of \$623 per trip, compared with an average of \$347 spent 22 per trip by other visitors; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Hawaii has many noteworthy and culturally unique areas of interest, including Bishop Museum, Iolani Palace, 25 Lahaina Whaling Town, Ewa Plantation Village, Waikiki 26 Natatorium, churches, temples, heiaus, Pearl Harbor, and the 27 28 Pacific Aviation Museum, which was recently ranked as one of the 29 ten best aviation museums in the United States; and 30



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1 WHEREAS, a 2009 audit of the Hawaii Tourism Authority found 2 a lack of long term vision and strategic planning to promote and increase all sectors of tourism in the State; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority, combined with the 6 expertise of the Department of Business, Economic Development, 7 and Tourism; the State Historic Preservation Division; the Office of Hawaiian Affairs; and other culturally based community 8 groups, has the resources to formulate a comprehensive plan to 9 invest in historic and culturally based tourism opportunities in 10 the State; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the Heritage Caucus of the Hawaii State 14 Legislature is proud of the resources and talent that showcases 15 our culturally diverse and unique State; now, therefore, **16**, 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Tourism 19 20 Authority is requested to convene a task force to study opportunities to promote and expand heritage tourism in the 21 22 State; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is 25 requested to compose the task force of the following members: 26 (1)The Director of Business, Economic Development, and 27 Tourism, or the Director's designee; 28 29 (2)30 A representative from the State Historic Preservation 31 Division, Department of Land and Natural Resources; 32 (3) 33 A representative from the State Foundation on Culture 34 and the Arts; and 35 (4) The Chairperson of the Board of the Office of Hawaiian 36 37 Affairs; and 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is 39 40 requested to invite a representative from each of the following organizations to serve as members of the task force: 41 42 43 (1)Historic Hawaii Foundation; 44
