## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING THAT THE ASIA-PACIFIC ECONOMIC COOPERATION HOST COMMITTEE SELECT PRODUCTS UNIQUE TO HAWAII THAT SHOWCASE HAWAII'S EXCELLENCE IN AGRICULTURE.

1 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has an opportunity to develop a new industry in the growing, cultivating, processing, and 2 shipping of Hawaii-grown produce to the mainland United States, 3 Asia and the rest of the world; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, Hawaii is the only state in close proximity to 7 both Asia and the continental United States, and is ideally located to capture and prosper from the opportunities of a 8 growing agriculture market worldwide; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a once in a 20-year opportunity to 11 seize the momentum of the growing success and popularity of 12 locally grown agricultural products; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rich soil and perennial warm climate position it as the only state in the United States to 16 17 commercially grow papaya, cacao, sugar, coffee, and many other 18 products; and 19 WHEREAS, the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation, is the 20 premier forum for Asia-Pacific economies to cooperate on 21 22 regional trade and investment issues; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Hawaii can seize the opportunity by offering dignitaries of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Hawaii's 25 finest agricultural products, including locally grown tropical 26 27 flowers and foliage, vegetables, and fruits, such as papaya, mango, lilikoi, pineapple, and Ka'u orange, and other popular 28 value-added products, including confections, jams and jellies, 29 30 and seasonings; and
