HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AN UPDATE ON THE PROGRESS OF THEIR ACTION PLAN AND AN OVERVIEW OF THEIR STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS THE DIABETES EPIDEMIC IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the 2010 Hawaii Diabetes Plan states that more 2 than 110,000 persons in Hawaii have diabetes and that approximately 39,000 of said persons do not yet know of their 3 4 illness; and 5 WHEREAS, the Plan further states that many diabetes-related 6 7 complications can be prevented or reduced through improved selfcare, early detection and early treatment; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Plan is created within the Department of 10 Health, by the Hawaii Diabetes Prevention and Control Program, 11 information for the requested update will be easily accessible 12 to the Department; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Plan states that research conducted by the 15 Center for Disease Control suggests a strong link between the 16 17 development of diabetes and a person's lifestyle behaviors, such as obesity, treatment of pre-diabetes should be a priority for 18 19 the Department; and 20 WHEREAS, the Department considers the effective treatment 21 of obesity an issue of significant importance, and openly 22 acknowledges the urgency of need for an intervention in 23 healthcare settings, such that the number of persons with 24 25 obesity and other prevalent pre-diabetes conditions be reduced; 26 and 27 28 WHEREAS, the Plan estimates that direct medical costs, such

1 WHEREAS, the State is currently facing substantial 2 3 projected budgetary shortfalls that could impede the development of an obesity prevention pilot program, or any other program 4 5 with similar intent; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Department has acknowledged the Hawaii obesity 8 epidemic, and has stated that it is currently being addressed 9 through the efforts of programs such as the Healthy Hawaii Initiative and the Family Health Services Division, but has not 10 11 provided evidence of their progress to date; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the requested update will benefit residents of the State of Hawaii by providing strategic information to State 14 15 lawmakers, who concur with the Department on their fiscal 16 concerns in regards to unknown costs associated with the 17 implementation of an obesity prevention pilot program; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health 22 23 shall provide a written update to the Legislature containing the current strategies for addressing the diabetes epidemic, an 24 estimate of the costs incurred as a result of the successful 25 26 implementation of an obesity prevention pilot program, and a 27 description of the innovative solutions that will address the 28 pre-diabetes problem; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department's report shall 31 be submitted to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 32 to the convening of the 2012 regular session; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 35 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Director of the State Department of Health, the 36 37 Director of the State Department of Human Services, the Director 38 of the Department of Education, the Director of the Office of 39 Hawaiian Affairs and the President of the University of Hawaii. 40 41 42 43 44 HCR HMIA 1035.doc
