HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST AS "NATIONAL ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK".

1 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has 227,000 citizens with 2 disabilities; and 3 WHEREAS, those citizens, who need a service dog, wait 4 5[°]· approximately 3 - 5 years for a service dog; and 6 7 WHEREAS, assistance dogs, which includes service dogs, 8 guide dogs, hearing alert dogs and alert/seizure response dogs, transform the lives of their human partners with physical and 9 mental disabilities; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, assistance dogs serve as devoted companions, 13 helpers, aides, best friends and close family members; and 14 WHEREAS, recognizing these dogs, who benefit Hawaii's 15 citizens with disabilities, will aid in raising awareness and 16 educate the public about how these specially trained animals are 17 aiding so many people in Hawaii and could benefit so many more 18 19 of Hawaii's citizens; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is requested 23 to express the State's support for the contributions of service 24 dogs to Hawaii's citizens with disabilities by proclaiming the 25 26 second week of August of every year, beginning on the second week of August 2011 as "Hawaii State Assistance Dogs Week" in 27 28 the State of Hawaii; and 29 30 FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this BE ፐጥ Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Hawaii and the 31 32 Hawaii Humane Society.
