HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST OF EVERY YEAR AS "HAWAII STATE ASSISTANCE DOGS WEEK".

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has 143,000 citizens with 1 disabilities; and 2 3 WHEREAS, those citizens who need a service dog wait 4 approximately three to five years for a service dog; and 5 6 WHEREAS, assistance dogs, including service dogs, guide 7 dogs, hearing alert dogs, and alert/seizure response dogs 8 transform the lives of their human partners with physical and 9 mental disabilities; and 10 11 WHEREAS, assistance dogs serve as devoted companions, 12 helpers, aides, best friends, and close family members; and 13 14 WHEREAS, recognizing these dogs, who benefit Hawaii's 15 citizens with disabilities, will aid in raising awareness and 16 educating the public about how these specially trained animals 17 are aiding many people in Hawaii and how these dogs could 18 19 benefit more of Hawaii's citizens; now, therefore, 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is requested 23 to express the State's support for the contributions of 24 assistance dogs to Hawaii's citizens with disabilities by 25 proclaiming the second week of August of every year, beginning 26 on the second week of August 2011, as "Hawaii State Assistance 27 Dogs Week" in the State of Hawaii; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the 31 Hawaii Humane Society. 32
