HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM, WITH INPUT FROM THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS, TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF JOINTLY ESTABLISHING A NATIVE HAWAIIAN RESEARCH, SCIENCE, AND TECHNOLOGY PARK.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's technology-related industries have shown 1 2 strong growth and potential for expansion; and 3 WHEREAS, the development of a research, science, and 4 5 technology park can be an important step in creating and sustaining a vibrant high-technology industry in the State; and 6 7 WHEREAS, there are a number of Native Hawaiian 8 9 entrepreneurs who have the desire but lack the resources to 10 develop projects in the research, science, and technology fields; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, a Native Hawaiian research, science, and technology park could be crucial for preparing Native Hawaiian 14 entrepreneurs to adequately deal with inevitable business start-15 up challenges by providing invaluable resources and professional 16 expertise; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 20 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 21 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, with input from the Office of 22 Hawaiian Affairs, is requested to examine the feasibility of 23 establishing, with the assistance of Native Hawaiian business 24 organizations, a Native Hawaiian research, science, and 25 technology park that will serve as an incubator and resource 26 center for Native Hawaiian entrepreneurs; provided that funding 27 for this examination is provided by the Native Hawaiian 28 29 Advancement Act; and
