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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO IMPLEMENT THE 'AHA MOKU COUNCILS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE 'AHA KIOLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, TO ADVISE THE STATE ON NATIVE HAWAIIAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PRACTICES.

WHEREAS, Act 212, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, as amended 1 by Act 39, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, established the 'Aha 2 Kiole Advisory Committee to initiate the process of creating a 3 system of best practices that is based upon the indigenous 4 resource practices of moku (regional) boundaries, which 5 6 acknowledge the natural contours of the land, the specific resources located within those areas, and the methodology 7 necessary to sustain resources and the community; and 8 9 WHEREAS, hundreds of cultural and traditional 10 practitioners, kupuna, farmers, fishers, educators, policy 11 makers, and other knowledgeable community members from dozens of 12 moku throughout the State have since joined together to discuss 13 best practices in the area of Hawaiian resource management; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in December 2010, the 'Aha Kiole Advisory 16 Committee issued its final report to the Legislature, in which 17 it recommends that the Legislature reestablish the 'aha moku 18 system, which is derived from Hawaii's traditional land division 19 system and includes the creation of an 'Aha Moku Council to 20 represent each moku; and 21 22 WHEREAS, according to the 'Aha Kiole Advisory Committee, 23 each 'Aha Moku Council would be a part of the municipality in 24 which it occurs and would consult with its respective county on 25 traditional natural resource and land management issues pursuant 26 to county jurisdictions and municipal authority; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 29 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 30



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of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and 1 Natural Resources is requested to implement the 'Aha Moku 2 Councils, as recommended by the 'Aha Kiole Advisory Committee, 3 to advise the State on Hawaiian resource management practices; 4 and 5

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that although the Department of Land 7 and Natural Resources should not be responsible for the 8 organization or oversight of any 'Aha Moku Council, the 9 Department of Land and Natural Resources is urged to develop a 10 process to acknowledge and recognize the established 'Aha Moku 11 Council from each moku as they approach the Department of Land 12 and Natural Resources; and 13 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayor 16 of each county, the Chairperson of the 'Aha Kiole Advisory 17 Committee, the Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Hawaiian 18 Affairs, and the Chairperson of the Committee on Hawaiian 19 Affairs of the House of Representatives. 20
