HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF DEVELOPING AN ARENA AND TESTING AND INSPECTION FACILITY ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS ON MOLOKAI FOR THE PURPOSE OF TESTING BACKYARD POULTRY FLOCKS FOR AVIAN DISEASES.

WHEREAS, there is a strong cultural tradition throughout 1 Hawaii and other Pacific islands of raising backyard flocks of 2 3 poultry; and 4 WHEREAS, owning poultry is a traditional part of the rural 5 environment in Hawaii, and poultry cohabitate naturally with 6 humans and other domesticated animals; and 7 8 WHEREAS, many persons who live on Hawaiian Home Lands own 9 backvard flocks of chickens and other poultry as a hobby that 10 provides them with a source of food, companionship, or 11 enjoyment; and 12 13 WHEREAS, avian influenza, Newcastle disease, and other 14 communicable avian diseases are a threat to public safety and 15 health, and if undetected, these diseases may spread from 16 backyard poultry flocks to wild birds, commercial poultry, and 17 humans; and 18 19 WHEREAS, many people in the Philippines also share a 20 tradition of raising backyard poultry flocks, and these poultry 21 owners and enthusiasts in the Philippines have long recognized 22 the importance of testing their poultry flocks for avian 23 24 diseases, and thus, the Araneta Coliseum was constructed to include a model testing facility for poultry inspections; and 25 26 WHEREAS, despite the popularity and cultural traditions of 27 backyard poultry in Hawaii, there is no comparable facility in 28

1 Hawaii for testing or inspecting backyard flocks of free-range poultry for communicable avian diseases; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the existence of a poultry inspection facility 4 for poultry owners who live on Hawaiian Home Lands could prevent 5 the spread of potentially fatal avian diseases, as well as 6 create jobs and have a positive economic impact in the State; 7 now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 11 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Hawaiian 12 Home Lands is requested to convene a task force to study the 13 feasibility of developing an arena and testing and inspection 14 facility on Hawaiian Home Lands on Molokai as a pilot project 15 for the purpose of testing backyard poultry flocks for avian 16 diseases; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 19 study the potential economic, social, tourism, and health 20 effects that would result from the construction of an arena and 21 testing and inspection facility for backyard poultry flocks on 22 Molokai; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is also 25 requested to study the feasibility of developing similar arenas 26 and testing and inspection facilities for backyard poultry 27 flocks on Hawaiian Home Lands on other islands of the State, 28 including the potential economic, social, tourism, and health 29 effects that would result; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 32 consist of the following members: 33 34 The Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, who 35 (1)shall serve as chairperson of the task force; 36 37 (2) Two members of the Molokai Game Fowl Association; 38 39 (3) One member of the Molokai Farmers Alliance; 40 41 One member of Kalama'ula Mauka Homestead Association; (4) 42 43 One member of Kamiloloa Homestead Association; 44 (5)HCR LRB 11-2563-1.doc

1 (6) One member of Kaa'akea Homestead Association; 2 3 (7) One member of Hoolehua Homestead Agriculture 4 Association; and 5 6 One member of the Molokai Livestock Association; and 7 (8) 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 9 submit a report of its findings, including its recommendations 10 and any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 11 one hundred eighty days prior to the convening of the Regular 12 Session of 2012; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 15 Bureau is requested to assist the task force with drafting any 16 legislation proposed by the task force; provided that the 17 chairperson of the task force submits a draft of the task 18 force's proposals to the Legislative Reference Bureau for 19 drafting in sufficient time to meet the task force's deadline 20 for submittal of its report; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be 23 dissolved upon the submission of its report to the Legislature; 24 and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 28 Hawaiian Homes Commission, who in turn is requested to transmit 29 copies to the entities listed herein, and the Director of the 30 Legislative Reference Bureau. 31 32 33 Mile Camel 34 OFFERED BY:
