## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE LEGISLATURE CONVENE AN INFORMATIONAL PUBLIC HEARING TO EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING NEW AND SEPARATE BARGAINING UNITS FOR HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION EMPLOYEES AND ALLOWING THE CORPORATION TO ENTER INTO ITS OWN COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS WITH THESE UNITS.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation is the 1 nation's fourth largest public health care organization and 2 comprises Hilo Medical Center, Hale Ho'ola Hamakua, and Ka'u 3 Hospital (East Hawaii Region); Kona Community Hospital and 4 Kohala Hospital (West Hawaii Region); Maui Memorial Medical 5 Center, Lanai Community Hospital, and Kula Hospital (Maui 6 Region); Leahi Hospital and Maluhia (Oahu Region); Kauai 7 Veterans Memorial Hospital and Samuel Mahelona Memorial Hospital 8 9 (Kauai Region); Yukio Okutsu State Veterans Home - Hilo; Roselani Place - Maui; Ali'i Health Center - West Hawaii; and 10 affiliate Hawaii Health Systems Corporation facility Kahuku 11 Medical Center - Oahu; and 12

14 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation provides 15 medical care services throughout the State and in most cases 16 Hawaii Health Systems Corporation facilities are the only 17 healthcare facilities in the rural areas of the State; and

19 WHEREAS, the 24/7 acute and long-term care medical services 20 provided by Hawaii Health Systems Corporation employees make 21 their work unique and different from other government workers in 22 the State; and

24 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 89-6(a), Hawaii Revised 25 Statutes, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation employees are 26 included in seven bargaining units that also include employees of 27 other public employers; and 28



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WHEREAS, pursuant to section 89-6(d), Hawaii Revised 1 Statutes, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation is allowed but a 2 single vote for the purpose of negotiating collective bargaining 3 agreements with the exclusive representatives of its employees 4 and making decisions as part of the public employer group; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, section 89-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, only authorizes the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation to negotiate 8 with exclusive representatives and execute memorandums of 9 understanding to alter collective bargaining agreements; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the present structure of chapter 89, Hawaii 12 13 Revised Statutes, restricts the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation's ability to independently negotiate collective 14 bargaining agreements that would allow the Hawaii Health Systems 15 Corporation to expeditiously respond to and address the 16 unique issues inherent in its 24/7 hospital operations, 17 18 including census, acuity, process improvement, and most importantly, quality patient care; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the rapid changes taking 21 place in the health care industry, the impending implementation 22 of national health care reform, and the current state of the 23 economy render imperative the need to give the Hawaii Health 24 Systems Corporation the appropriate flexibility and autonomy 25 needed to manage its employees; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 28 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 29 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the House of 30 Representatives and the Senate are requested to convene a joint 31 informational public hearing for the purpose of: 32 33 34 Evaluating the feasibility of establishing new and (1)separate bargaining units for Hawaii Health Systems 35 Corporation employees and allowing the corporation to 36 enter into its own collective bargaining agreements 37 with these units; and 38 39 Identifying any statutory or other amendments that may (2) 40 be necessary to effectuate the foregoing and to 41 facilitate the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation's

commitment and ability to provide quality health care

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for the people of Hawaii through the State's communityhospital system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor, Department of 4 Health, Department of Human Resources Development, Office of 5 Collective Bargaining and Managed Competition, Hawaii Labor 6 Relations Board, Hawaii Government Employees Association, 7 United Public Workers, each county mayor, and the Hawaii Health 8 Systems Corporation, including representatives of each regional 9 system and corporate board of Hawaii Health Systems 10 Corporation, are requested to participate in the 11 informational public hearing; and 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate appoint members from each house of the Legislature to constitute a joint committee for the purpose of conducting the informational public hearing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Speaker of 21 22 the House of Representatives; President of the Senate; mayor of each county; Director of Health, Director of Human Resources 23 Development, Chief Negotiator for the State, Chairperson of the 24 Hawaii Labor Relations Board, Executive Director of the Hawaii 25 Government Employees Association, State Director of the United 26 Public Workers, President and Chief Executive Officer of the 27 Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, Chairperson of the Hawaii 28 Health Systems Corporation Board of Directors, and the 29 Chairperson of each Hawaii Health Systems Corporation Regional 30 System Board of Directors. 31
