HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO PERFORM A FINANCIAL AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF KEALAKEHE HIGH SCHOOL.

1 WHEREAS, Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004 (Act 51), also 2 known as the "Reinventing Education Act of 2004", was designed 3 to provide comprehensive education reform in Hawaii's public 4 schools by, among other things, reducing the bureaucracy within 5 the Department of Education and focusing more resources and 6 control at the individual school level; and

8 WHEREAS, Act 51 established a weighted student formula for 9 allocating operating funds to individual public schools that 10 uses a system of weighted characteristics affecting the relative 11 cost of educating each student; and

13 WHEREAS, Act 51 also enhanced decision-making at the school 14 level by increasing principals' budgeting authority and spending 15 flexibility, making principals more accountable for determining 16 methods to improve student achievement; and

18 WHEREAS, because the weighted student formula allocates 19 school funds based on student need, there have been concerns 20 that some schools would lose money and resources to a degree 21 that would harm student achievement; and

WHEREAS, there have also been doubts regarding the ability
of school principals to meet the increased demands and
responsibilities that Act 51 places upon them, including greater
control over school budgets; and

WHEREAS, in 2006, the Auditor performed a management audit of Kailua High School that provided a preliminary assessment of the ability of public schools to meet the new requirements of Act 51; and 32



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WHEREAS, the Auditor concluded in its Report No. 06-06, 1 2 that stronger leadership and better management practices were needed to prepare Kailua High School for greater autonomy and 3 4 responsibility for decision-making and educational outcomes 5 under Act 51; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Auditor's report noted that "the deficiencies evident at Kailua High suggest that other Hawai'i schools may be 8 9 similarly unprepared to shoulder the additional responsibility delegated by Act 51"; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, according to a 2010 news report, the Auditor 13 stated that a comprehensive management audit of the Department 14 of Education, including a school-by-school audit, would require significant amounts of money and time; and 15 16 WHEREAS, an audit of a single public school would be more 17 18 practical and would provide an updated example of how the weighted student formula and school management under Act 51 have 19 been working in actual practice; now, therefore, 20 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 24 perform a financial and management audit of Kealakehe High 25 School; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that 28 the financial and management audit, using the example of 29 Kealakehe High School, include an evaluation of: 30 31 The effectiveness of the weighted student formula 32 (1)established under section 302A-1303.6, Hawaii Revised 33 Statutes, in allocating school funds; 34 35 (2)The performance of the school principal in meeting the 36 37 school management responsibilities set forth in Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, and whether 38 39 principals can be reasonably expected to meet these responsibilities based on this example; and 40 41 (3) Any deficiencies identified in school management 42 43 practices under the requirements of Act 51, Session 44 Laws of Hawaii 2004; and HCR LRB 11-0379.doc . 2

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1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the principal of Kealakehe High 3 School is requested to cooperate fully with the Auditor in the 4 conduct of the financial and management audit; and 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 7 submit the results of the financial and management audit, 8 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 9 of 2012; and 10 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, the 13 14 Chairperson of the Board of Education, and the Principal of Kealakehe High School. 15 16 17 18
