HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A SUNRISE REVIEW TO DETERMINE WHETHER LARGE SCALE DOG BREEDERS SHOULD BE LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS.

1	WHEREAS, the large scale breeding of dogs is often
2	conducted under conditions that inflict long-term suffering on
3	the dogs; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the large scale breeding of dogs may lead to the
6	sale of unhealthy dogs to unsuspecting consumers; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, the State currently does not regulate the breeding
9	of dogs; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, establishing a licensing requirement for large
12	scale dog breeders would help prevent cruelty to dogs and
13	protect consumers; and
14	MURDERC - brooden ligence would presside at minimum for
15	WHEREAS, a breeder license would provide, at minimum, for
16 17	inspection of the breeding facility to ensure adequacy and cleanliness, a process for investigation, and the payment of
17 18	licensing fees; and
10 19	ricensing rees, and
20	WHEREAS, H.B. No. 1621, introduced during the Regular
21	Session of 2011, requires that, to operate a large scale dog
22	breeding operation, a person shall possess a valid dog breeder
23	license issued by the Department of Commerce and Consumer
24	Affairs; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, under section 26H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
27	measures that would subject unregulated professions and
28	occupations to licensing or other regulatory controls cannot be
29	enacted unless the Auditor has conducted a sunrise review of the
30	specific measure identified through a concurrent resolution;

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 2 3 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to perform a sunrise review of the regulation of large scale dog 4 5 breeders by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs as 6 contemplated under H.B. No. 1621, introduced during the Regular Session of 2011; provided that the review include an assessment 7 8 of alternative agencies that may be tasked with regulating large 9 scale dog breeders; and 10
