He is credited with finding several 15 varieties of Hawaiian kalo which were previously thought to be 16 17 extinct and in recent years has been involved with the Hawaiian 18 and taro farming communities' efforts to restore and perpetuate Hawaii's endemic food and medicinal plants and protect them from 19 genetic modification; and 20

22 WHEREAS, SHAD KANE has been an instrumental leader in the Hawaiian community as well as the Kapolei and Makakilo areas 23 through his involvement with numerous organizations such as the 24 Kapolei Hawaiian Civic Club, the Royal Order of Kamehameha 25 Ekahi, the O'ahu Island Burial Council, the Makakilo/Kapolei/ 26 Honokai Hale Neighborhood Board, and the West Oahu Employment 27 Corporation. He has worked tirelessly to give the new "Second 28 City" of Kapolei a strong Hawaiian cultural presence and has 29 30 additionally worked for the preservation of our island's cultural, historical and environmental heritage.
