## HOUSE RESOLUTION

CONVENING A LEGISLATIVE NOISE POLLUTION TASK FORCE TO REVIEW BEST PRACTICES FROM OTHER STATES IN REDUCING URBAN NOISE POLLUTION.

WHEREAS, the traditional definition of noise is "unwanted or disturbing sound", which becomes unwanted when it either interferes with normal activities such as sleeping, conversation, or disrupts or diminishes one's quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the fact that you cannot see, taste, or smell noise may help explain why it has not received as much attention as other types of pollution, such as air pollution, or water pollution; and

WHEREAS, noise pollution can have major consequences, primarily to a person's overall health; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown that there are direct links between noise and health problems related to noise, including stress-related illnesses, high blood pressure, speech interference, hearing loss, sleep disruption, and lost productivity; and

WHEREAS, noise-induced hearing loss is the most common and often discussed health effect, but research has shown that exposure to constant or high levels of noise can cause countless adverse health effects; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the Director of Health is requested to convene a Legislative Noise Pollution Task Force to review best practices 30 from other states in reducing noise pollution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to consist of:
