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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO REVIEW CONFIDENTIALITY LAWS PERTAINING TO COURT INVOLVED, MULTI-AGENCY YOUTH.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice's Office 1 of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, in concert with 2 the United States Department of Education and the United States 3 4 Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, identified juvenile 5 information sharing as an essential tool to assist juvenile 6 justice, education, health, and other youth-serving agencies in 7 their efforts to improve services for at-risk and delinquent 8 9 youth and their families; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinguency 11 Prevention's Juvenile Accountability Block Grants program has 12 identified information sharing as one of its program purpose 13 areas, "establishing and maintaining interagency information-14 sharing programs that enable the juvenile and criminal justice 15 systems, schools, and social service agencies to make more 16 17 informed decisions regarding the early identification, control, supervision, and treatment of juveniles who repeatedly commit 18 serious delinquent or criminal acts"; and 19

21 WHEREAS, in 2000, the Hawaii County Comprehensive Strategy 22 for Juvenile Justice recognized the need to establish procedures 23 and protocols to facilitate information sharing between county 24 and state agencies; and

26 WHEREAS, in a study submitted to the Legislature for the 27 2007 Regular Session, the Hawaii County Office of the 28 Prosecuting Attorney determined that families and youth involved 29 with multiple agencies are often confused about which service 30 provider has responsibility for which problem area and, as a 31 result, information given to officers and program providers may 32 be miscommunicated; and



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WHEREAS, in 2007, the Big Island Juvenile Intake and 1 Assessment Center Committee developed an agreement for 2 interagency information sharing, in which participating agencies 3 recognized that working with mutual youth clients in a more 4 collaborative manner would ensure more efficient and effective 5 services for youth in Hawaii County; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in 2010 and 2011, the Hawaii Mental Health 8 9 Transformation State Incentive Grant's Criminal Justice Task Force, recognized the need for information sharing on juvenile 10 matters, that barriers currently exist that obstruct the sharing 11 of information, and that the Attorney General has done 12 preliminary work in researching the federal and state 13 confidentiality laws touching upon the many departments they 14 advise; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 of 2011, that the Department of the Attorney General is 19 requested to: 20 21 Review existing federal and state laws and agency (1)22 rules relating to confidentiality, privacy, and 23 privilege and their impact on interagency information 24 sharing; and 25 26 Make recommendations to better serve the youth of (2) 27 Hawaii through appropriate and necessary sharing of 28 information involving the youth; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney 31 General is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, 32 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature and 33 affected government agencies, including but not limited to the 34 Department of Human Services, the Department of Health, the 35 Department of Education, and the Police Department and the 36 Office of the Prosecuting Attorney of each county, not later 37 than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2012 Regular 38 39 Session; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 41 Resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General; the Director 42 of Human Services; the Director of Health; the Superintendent of 43



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Education; the Chairperson of the Board of Education; and the
Police Chief and Prosecuting Attorney of each county.
