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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF CLOSED PRIMARIES CONDUCTED BY OTHER STATES AND THE CORRESPONDING EFFECT ON VOTER TURNOUT.

1 WHEREAS, the various states are free to conduct primary elections however the respective state deems appropriate, as 2 long as individuals' constitutional rights are protected; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii conducts open primaries where a voter may 5 6 choose which primary to vote in without being required to register with a political party; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in California Democratic Party v. Jones, 530 U.S. 9 567 (2000), the United States Supreme Court ruled that a 10 political party has a right, guaranteed by the First Amendment 11 12 of the United States Constitution, to limit participation in its 13 primary elections to persons who are members of that political 14 party; and 15 WHEREAS, currently, eleven states conduct closed primary 16 elections that require a voter to be a registered member of the 17 political party holding the primary; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the State has a compelling interest in increasing 20 voter participation in primary elections to ensure a 21 22 representative form of government; and 23 WHEREAS, it is unclear whether open or closed primary 24 elections result in a higher voter turnout in those 25 jurisdictions; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 28 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 29 of 2011, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to 30 conduct a study to determine the types of closed primary 31 elections conducted by other states and the corresponding 32 33 effect, if any, on voter turnout in those jurisdictions; and



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2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 3 Bureau is requested to report its findings to the Legislature no 4 later than twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 2012; and 5

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 7 Resolution be transmitted to the Acting Director of the 8 Legislative Reference Bureau, the President of the Senate, and 9 the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Legislature 10 of the State of Hawaii.
