HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO INCLUDE, AS PART OF THE MINIMUM COURSE AND CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION, A REQUIREMENT THAT ALL PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS OBTAIN CREDIT FOR THE EQUIVALENT OF ONE YEAR OF INSTRUCTION IN HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

1	WHEREAS, in the late 1800s, a law of the Republic of Hawaii
2 3	required that the English language be used as the sole medium and basis for instruction in all public and private schools; and
4	and basis for instruction in all public and private schools, and
5	WHEREAS, in accordance with the English-only law, the
6	Hawaiian language was strictly forbidden at school and students
7	who spoke Hawaiian were punished; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, as a result of the suppression of the Hawaiian
10 11	language, the opportunity to speak Hawaiian outside one's home diminished and the Hawaiian language neared extinction; and
12	diminished and the nawarran ranguage heared extinction, and
13	WHEREAS, efforts to revive the Hawaiian language began in
14	the 1970s; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, after the 1978 constitutional convention, voters
17 18	ratified several amendments to the state constitution relating to the Hawaiian language; and
19	to the nawarran ranguage, and
20	WHEREAS, article XV, section 4 of the Constitution of the
21	State of Hawaii recognizes Hawaiian as one of two official
22	languages of the State; and
23	
24 25	WHEREAS, article X, section 4 of the state constitution
25 26	directs the State to promote the study of Hawaiian culture, history, and language, and requires that the State provide a
20 27	Hawaiian education program in the public schools; and

29	WHEREAS, the recognition and preservation of the Hawaiian
30	language is important because the language is essential to the
31	preservation and perpetuation of the Hawaiian culture; and
