HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO REPORT ON THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A LABELING SYSTEM FOR GENETICALLY ENGINEERED FOODS.

1 WHEREAS, the growth of genetically engineered food production has been swift and pervasive throughout the nation; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, the term "genetically engineered food" most commonly refers to crop plants created for human or animal 6 consumption using the latest molecular biology techniques in the 7 8 laboratory to enhance desired traits such as increased resistance to herbicides or improved nutritional content; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the effort to incorporate genetically engineered 11 foods into the general food supply is sometimes met with 12 resistance from consumers; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, numerous nations, including Japan, the Republic of China, and countries of the European Union, require labeling of 16 genetically engineered foods; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, developing and implementing an effective means of identifying genetically engineered products would help mitigate 20 consumers' fears and uncertainties; and 21 22 WHEREAS, local agricultural producers and retailers could 23 benefit from a consistent labeling system to better inform 24 consumers of the varying methods employed to develop 25 agricultural products; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 28 29 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the Director of Health is requested to report to 30 the Legislature on the feasibility of implementing a labeling 31 system for food products that contain genetically engineered 32 33 material, including clear and objective methods to identify genetically engineered material; and 34 HR LRB 11-1686.doc

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1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that 3 the report also consider the impact of legislation that: 4 5 (1)Mandates the labeling of food products that contain genetically engineered material; and 6 7 8 (2) Establishes sanctions for violations of the labeling 9 requirement; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 12 requested to collaborate with the Attorney General, the Department of Agriculture, and local agricultural producers and 13 retailers in preparing the report; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 16 requested to submit the report no later than twenty days prior 17 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, the 21 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, the Attorney General, 22 the Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, the 23 Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Hawaii Organic 24 Farmers Association, the Chairperson of the Board of the Hawaii 25 Farmers Union, the Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Food 26 Industry Association, and the Chairperson of the Executive 27 Committee of the Retail Merchants of Hawaii. 28 29 30 31 OFFERED BY:
