## HOUSE RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHES THE MULTIPLE CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZER TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP A STRATEGIC, INTEGRATED, AND COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO INTEGRATE MULTIPLE CHARTER SCHOOL AUTHORIZERS INTO HAWAII'S CHARTER SCHOOL LAW.

WHEREAS, charter schools are public schools that operate 1 with less regulation, giving parents an opportunity to choose a 2 school they believe is more suitable for their children's 3 4 education; and 5 6 · WHEREAS, there are 31 charter schools in Hawai`i with an enrollment of around 8,200 students; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the growth of charter schools is limited due to a 9 cap that only allows for authorization of up to three new 10 charter schools upon the accreditation of one existing charter 11 school for three or more years; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Hawai`i's charter schools are in high demand with 14 more than 3,000 prospective students on waiting lists and not 15 enough room to accommodate them; and 16 17 WHEREAS, charter school authorizers are entities charged by 18 law to approve new schools, monitor their compliance with 19 applicable laws, and regulations, and evaluate their performance 20 to make decisions about charter renewal and closure; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, Hawai`i has one authorizer, the Charter School Review Panel, made up of twelve members representing various 24 constituencies in Hawai`i's education community, and is 25 appointed by and under the oversight of the Board of Education; 26 and 27 28

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1 WHEREAS, multiple authorizers is the term given to entities 2 other than local school boards that have authority under state law to approve charter schools; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, allowing multiple authorizers grant various groups a broader range of paths to obtaining a charter, brings the 6 resources of outside entities and organizations, and helps 7 ensure accountability through a strong authorizer school 8 9 relationship; and 10 WHEREAS, the National Alliance For Public Charter Schools, 11 12 a leading national organization dedicated to advancing the charter school movement advocates for multiple authorizers as 13 14 reflected in its Model Law; and 15 16 WHEREAS, of the forty states with charter school laws, 17 twenty-one allow multiple authorizers; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the implementation of multiple authorizers in Hawaii requires more study on implementation and integration 20 into Hawaii's unique one school district state; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular 24 Session of 2011, that the Multiple Charter School Authorizer 25 26 Task Force be created to: 27 Develop a strategic, integrated, and comprehensive 28 (1) 29 plan to integrate multiple authorizers into Hawaii's charter school law; and 30 31 (2) Determine organization or institutions that would be 32 33 granted chartering authority; and 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force consist of seven 35 members as follows; and 36 37 (1) One member appointed by the Governor; 38 39 40 (2) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House; 41
