HOUSE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE SEVERITY OF THE CRISIS BEING EXPERIENCED BY THE PEOPLE OF JAPAN WITH THE RECENT EVENTS OF AN EARTHQUAKE AND TSUNAMI AND SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF ORGANIZATIONS WITHIN HAWAII TO ASSIST THE PEOPLE OF JAPAN.

WHEREAS, on Friday, March 11, 2011, the country of Japan 1 2 experienced its most severe natural disaster in the past century with a 9.0 magnitude earthquake, followed by numerous 3 4 aftershocks and massive destruction by a tsunami, with the 5 consequent loss of life and property; and 6 7 WHEREAS, a number of villages and population centers now 8 face the crises caused by the destruction of homes, stores and 9 offices, commercial complexes, harbors and airports, roads and bridges, and other infrastructure, including nuclear power 10 plants; and 11 12 WHEREAS, many families living in areas most severely 13 damaged are now homeless, and many lack the basic necessities of 14 electricity, water and food, and medical care, and are facing 15 the need for the massive clean-up of debris in their communities 16 17 and consequent safety and health issues; and 18 19 WHEREAS, damage to Japan's nuclear plants not only limits the country's ability to generate electricity but also presents 20 an ominous threat of nuclear injury and creates an atmosphere of 21 severe stress and apprehension among the people; and 22 23 WHEREAS, besides the physical toll and physical loss 24 experienced by the people of Japan, there are the psychological 25 and mental stress suffered by persons and families who have 26 experienced the sudden loss of loved ones, leading to deep and 27 profound personal sadness; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, the people of Japan have deep historical, cultural and family ties with the people of Hawaii through financial and 31 business inter-connections, and in multi-generational family 32 33 relationships; and

WHEREAS, the people of Hawaii wish to express their
compassion for the plight of the people of Japan and desire to
generously offer assistance to them, financially, medically, or
in other ways; now, therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that a joint letter be prepared by the majority and 8 minority leaders of the Hawaii State Legislature together with 9 the Governor of Hawaii and sent to the Prime Minister of Japan 10 11 expressing the condolences of the people of Hawaii for the recent catastrophic events and the determination of the people 12 13 of Hawaii to support and help the people of Japan; and 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the local chapters of the Red Cross and Salvation Army, local churches, and charities continue to assist where possible by sending basic necessities such as clothing, blankets, non-perishable food, and medical supplies to Japan; and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Prime Minister of Japan and to 22 23 each Governor in each of the 47 Prefectures, President of the United States, President Pro Tempore of the United States 24 Senate, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, 25 26 Governor of the State of Hawaii, The Salvation Army-Hawaiian & Pacific Islands Division, and American Red Cross-Hawaii State 27 28 Chapter.
