HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO RELEASE PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL LEASES TO ITS BENEFICIARIES.

WHEREAS, native Hawaiians have traditionally had close ties 1 2 to the land; and 3 4 WHEREAS, after contact with the West: 5 Native Hawaiians' traditional ties to their lands were 6 (1) 7 disrupted; and 8 9 (2) The size of the native Hawaiian population began to decrease because of the introduction of new illnesses 10 and diseases to which native Hawaiians had not 11 previously been exposed; 12 13 14 and \cdot 15 WHEREAS, it was and continues to be widely believed that 16 one way to improve the condition of native Hawaiians is to 17 provide them with greater access to ancestral lands; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, as Hawaii's delegate to the United States Congress, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalanianaole spearheaded the 21 22 passage of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, designed to create a rehabilitation program for the dwindling numbers of 23 24 native Hawaiians; and 25 WHEREAS, in 1921, with the enactment of the Hawaiian Homes 26 27 Commission Act, 1920, the United States set aside approximately 200,000 acres of land to establish a permanent homeland for 28 native Hawaiians, who were a landless and "dying" people; and 29

1	WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, was
2	subsequently incorporated into the Hawaii State Constitution;
3	and

5	WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands was
6	established by the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, and is
7	headed by an executive board known as the Hawaiian Homes
8	Commission; and

	WIEDENG the Department of Neuroisen Neme Landa europe
10	WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands owes a
11	fiduciary duty to its beneficiaries; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, it is essential that the beneficiaries of the
14	Department of Hawaiian Home Lands gain access to lands set aside
15	for them as expeditiously as possible; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, pastoral and agricultural leases are an important,
18	valuable, and viable use of Hawaiian Home Lands; now, therefore,
19	
20	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
21	Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
22	of 2011, that the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is urged to
23	release pastoral and agricultural leases to its beneficiaries;
24	and
25	
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Hawaiian Home
27	Lands submit to the Legislature, no later than 20 days prior to
28	the convening of the Regular Session of 2012, a report of its
29	activities and efforts with respect to the release of pastoral
30	and agricultural leases to its beneficiaries; and

32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
33	Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States,
34	Hawaii's Congressional delegation, the Governor, the chairperson
35	of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and the chairperson of the
36	Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.
