HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF REQUIRING PROOF OF MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE TO PURCHASE FUEL.

WHEREAS, according to a January 2009 article in The 1 Honolulu Advertiser, an Insurance Research Council report stated 2 that one in eight, or approximately twelve per cent, of Hawaii 3 drivers were uninsured in 2007; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the report by the Insurance Research Council also 7 found a strong correlation between the per cent of uninsured motorists and the unemployment rate; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, an increase in the unemployment rate of one percentage point is associated with an increase in the uninsured 11 motorist rate of more than three-quarters of a percentage point; 12 and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, the Insurance Commissioner responded to the report and said the rate could even be higher, and some analysts 16 believed several years ago that it was closer to one in five, or 17 18 twenty per cent; and 19 WHEREAS, uninsured motorists are a problem because when an 20 21 uninsured motorist is in an accident, other motorists often have to sue to collect damages or rely on insurance to recover any 22 23 loss; and 24 WHEREAS, uninsured motorist coverage is intended to pay for 25 damages to an insured driver on behalf of an uninsured motorist; 26 27 and 28 29 WHEREAS, one suggested approach to removing uninsured drivers from the road is to deny them access to purchase 30 gasoline at gas stations, by issuing motor vehicle insurance 31 cards to insured motorists to allow them to purchase gas; and 32 33 WHEREAS, a motor vehicle insurance card that is 34 electronically readable has other benefits, such as: 35 36

- (1) Reducing the number of uninsured motorists; 1 2 Reducing insurance costs by reducing the premium of 3 (2) 4 uninsured motorist coverage; and 5 Coordinating insurance requirements with other 6 (3) 7 requirements such as driver licenses and safety 8 checks; now, therefore, 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 11 of 2011, that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to study 12 the feasibility of requiring motor vehicle insurance companies 13 to issue motor vehicle insurance cards to insured drivers and to 14 require that the card be scanned electronically or examined by 15 sellers of gasoline as a precondition to purchasing gasoline; 16 17 and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner 19 report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature, 20 including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days 21 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 24 Resolution be transmitted to the Insurance Commissioner. 25 26 27 28 OFFERED BY:
