## HOUSE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY OPPORTUNITIES TO PROMOTE AND EXPAND HERITAGE TOURISM.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has a unique and culturally rich heritage 1 that can be found in its architecture, artifacts, oral and 2 written histories, music, dress, foods, and people; and 3 4 WHEREAS, with nearly six-and-a-half million visitors a year 5 from around the world who spend more than \$12,000,000,000 a 6 year, the visitor industry is the State's primary economic 7 driver; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, one of the fastest developing segments of the visitor industry, Heritage Tourism, focuses on sharing Hawaii's 11 rich cultural diversity with visitors; and 12 13 WHEREAS, heritage tourism is a clean, low-impact, 14 ecologically sensitive way to grow and develop the visitor 15 industry and strengthen Hawaii's economy; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has 18 conducted various studies that find that tourists who visit 19 historic sites and cultural attractions stay longer and spend an 20 average of \$623 per trip, compared with an average of \$347 spent 21 per trip by other visitors; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Hawaii has many noteworthy and culturally unique 24 25 areas of interest, including Bishop Museum, Iolani Palace, Lahaina Whaling Town, Ewa Plantation Village, Waikiki 26 Natatorium, churches, temples, heiaus, Pearl Harbor, and the 27 28 Pacific Aviation Museum, which was recently ranked as one of the ten best aviation museums in the United States; and 29 30 WHEREAS, a 2009 audit of the Hawaii Tourism Authority found 31 a lack of long term vision and strategic planning to promote and 32 increase all sectors of tourism in the State; and 33 34



1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority, combined with the 2 expertise of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; the State Historic Preservation Division; the 3 4 Office of Hawaiian Affairs; and other culturally based community 5 groups, has the resources to formulate a comprehensive plan to 6 invest in historic and culturally based tourism opportunities in 7 the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Heritage Caucus of the Hawaii State 10 Legislature is proud of the resources and talent that showcases our culturally diverse and unique State; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2011, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to 16 convene a task force to study opportunities to promote and expand heritage tourism in the State; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to compose the task force of the following members: 20 21 The Director of Business, Economic Development, and 22 (1)23 Tourism, or the Director's designee; 24 (2)25 A representative from the State Historic Preservation Division, Department of Land and Natural Resources; 26 27 (3) A representative from the State Foundation on Culture 28 29 and the Arts; and 30 31 (4) The Chairperson of the Board of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to invite a representative from each of the following 35 organizations to serve as members of the task force: 36 37 (1) Historic Hawaii Foundation; 38 39 (2) Arts of Aloha; 40 41 42 (3) Haleiwa Main Street Program; 43 44 (4) Bishop Museum; HR LRB 11-2071.doc 2
