## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE SUPPORT FOR HOME ORGANIC PRODUCE COOPERATIVES.

WHEREAS, citizens of the state of Hawaii who grow fruits 1 2 and vegetables in gardens at their place of residence for their 3 own consumption often have a surplus of these fruits and vegetables; and 4 5 WHEREAS, if the efforts of such citizens could be 6 7 organized to form cooperatives their surpluses could be sold in 8 the local market and the State would be less dependent on 9 imported produce; and 10 WHEREAS, home organic produce cooperatives could be a 11 means to educate home gardeners about growing organic produce, 12 assist home gardeners to market their produce and advise home 13 gardeners on any other pertinent matters relating to the 14 15 marketing and selling of surplus organic produce to the general 16 public; and 17 WHEREAS, the State supports the development of the organic 18 industry as a viable agricultural practice that promotes both 19 the recycling of bio-regional resources and the local 20 production and consumption for a self-reliant industry ; now, 21 therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 25 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, Senate concurring, that the University of Hawaii 26 College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources and its 27 extension service, with assistance from the Department of 28 Agriculture, and the Department of Business, Economic 29 Development, and Tourism, is urged to develop a coordinated plan 30 31 to provide assistance and support to citizen gardeners who may be interested in forming community-based home organic produce 32 33 cooperatives; and
