13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, a permanent solution to the problem may require drastic action, such as prohibiting locating fraternity and sorority houses and single-family homes in the same residentia			
17 18 19	area; and WHEREAS, on Oahu, the City and County of Honolulu is
