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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A STATEWIDE COMMUNITY LAND TRUST TO PROMOTE HOMEOWNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has traditionally been unable to provide an adequate amount of permanent, affordable housing for residents; 2 studies estimate between seventeen thousand and twenty thousand 3 homes need to be built to provide decent, safe affordable homes 4 for our population; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the American dream of owning a home should be 7 8 within the reach of Hawaii's families; home ownership, which is 9 often a family's largest investment, can become the base upon which a family builds their assets; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, it has been demonstrated that community land trusts can help address the need for permanent, affordable 13 14 housing by: 15 Purchasing homes, including homes that fall into 16 (1)foreclosure; 17 18 (2) Putting restrictions of the price and occupancy of the 19 homes through ground lease covenants; and 20 21 22 (3) Selling the homes to income-qualified families at below-market prices; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Na Hale O Maui has done an exemplary job of 25 successfully using federal funding from the Neighborhood 26 27 Stabilization Program to acquire, rehabilitate, and sell bankowned foreclosure homes as community land trust housing; Na Hale 28 O Maui currently has a goal of completing twenty homes in this 29 funding cycle; and 30 31 32

32 WHEREAS, the Na Hale O Maui community land trust could 33 serve as a successful model for a statewide organization with



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1 professional leadership and centralized administration, providing many residents the potential to own a home in the 2 3 State; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii has many noteworthy, dedicated 6 organizations involved in affordable housing and land management, including but not limited to, Maui Coastal Land 7 8 Trust, Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation, 9 Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, Hawaii Public Housing 10 Authority, Hawaii Community Development Authority, Trust for Public Lands, Affordable Housing Alliance, Self-Help Housing 11 Hawaii, Mutual Housing Association of Hawaii, and Hawaii Habitat 12 13 for Humanity; and 14 15 WHEREAS, other states have been successful in developing regional community land trust programs including Vermont, 16 Minnesota, Oregon, Montana, and Washington; Delaware has a 17 18 single statewide community land trust to centralize administrative functions as a non-profit entity; and 19 20 WHEREAS, these states, along with the Na Hale O Maui 21 community land trust, offer important insights on how to create 22 23 community land trusts to increase the amount of affordable housing in Hawaii; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, the opportunity exists to partner with national programs through the National Community Land Trust Network, 27 Housing Land Advocates, the Community Land Trust Academy, and 28 29 the Land Trust Accreditation Commission; now, therefore, 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 32 33 of 2011, that the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development 34 Corporation is requested to convene a statewide community land 35 trust task force to study the establishment of a statewide community land trust to promote homeownership opportunities in 36 Hawaii; and 37 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force include, but not be limited to, the following members: 40 41 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 42 43 Resources, or the Chairperson's designee; 44 2
