## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A STATEWIDE COMMUNITY LAND TRUST TO PROMOTE HOMEOWNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has traditionally been unable to provide an 1 adequate amount of permanent, affordable housing for residents: 2 Studies estimate that between 17,000 and 20,000 homes need to be 3 4 built to provide decent, safe, and affordable homes for our 5 population; and 6 WHEREAS, the American dream of owning a home should be 7 within the reach of Hawaii's families, and home ownership, which 8 9 is often a family's largest investment, can become the base upon which a family builds its assets; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, it has been demonstrated that community land 13 trusts can help address the need for permanent, affordable housing by: 14 15 Purchasing homes, including homes that fall into 16 (1) foreclosure; 17 18 (2) Putting restrictions on the price and occupancy of 19 20 homes through ground lease covenants; and 21 (3) Selling the homes to income-qualified families at 22 below-market prices; 23 24 and 25 26 WHEREAS, Na Hale O Maui has done an exemplary job of 27 28 successfully using federal funding from the Neighborhood 29 Stabilization Program to acquire, rehabilitate, and sell bankowned foreclosure homes as community land trust housing; Na Hale 30 O Maui currently has a goal of completing 20 homes in this 31 32 funding cycle; and

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WHEREAS, the Na Hale O Maui community land trust could 1 2 serve as a successful model for a statewide organization with 3 professional leadership and a centralized administration to 4 provide many residents the potential to own a home in the State; 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii has many noteworthy, dedicated 8 organizations involved in affordable housing and land 9 management, including Maui Coastal Land Trust, Hawaii Housing 10 Finance and Development Corporation, Department of Hawaiian Home 11 Lands, Hawaii Public Housing Authority, Hawaii Community Development Authority, The Trust for Public Land, Affordable 12 Housing Alliance, Self-Help Housing Corporation of Hawaii, 13 Mutual Housing Association of Hawaii, and Hawaii Habitat for 14 Humanity; and 15 16 WHEREAS, several states have been successful in developing 17 18 regional community land trust programs, such as Vermont, Minnesota, Oregon, Montana, and Washington; Delaware has a 19 20 single statewide community land trust to centralize administrative functions as a non-profit entity; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, these states, along with the Na Hale O Maui community land trust, offer important insights on how to create 24 community land trusts to increase the amount of affordable 25 26 housing in Hawaii; and 27 28 WHEREAS, the opportunity exists to partner with national programs through the National Community Land Trust Network, 29 Housing Land Advocates, the Community Land Trust Academy, and 30 31 the Land Trust Accreditation Commission; now, therefore, 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 33 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 34 of 2011, that the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development 35 Corporation is requested to convene a statewide community land 36 37 trust task force to study the establishment of a statewide community land trust to promote homeownership opportunities in 38 39 Hawaii; and
